#### DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

**Synopsis:** Funding of NAS pilot project. Extends the expiration date of the maternal neonatal opioid addiction project to January 1, 2022. Makes an appropriation from the state general fund to the project.

5	SECTION, "division" means the division of mental health and
6	addiction as established by IC 12-21-1-1.
7	(b) There is appropriated to the division:
8	(1) four hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$450,000) beginning
9	July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020; and
10	(2) four hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$450,000) beginning
11	July 1, 2020, and ending June 30, 2021;
12	from the state general fund for the division's use in administering
13	the maternal neonatal opioid addiction project under IC 12-23-22
14	(c) This SECTION expires July 1, 2021.
