DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 35-46-1-23.

**Synopsis:** Transportation of minor for prohibited procedures. Makes assisting a child in procuring a gender transition procedure a Level 6 felony.

Effective: July 1, 2025.
