

SENATE BILL No. 488

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 9-13-2; IC 9-21-11-12; IC 9-24; IC 9-26-1-1.5.

Synopsis: Driving authority permits. Provides for the issuance of driving authority permits, probationary driving authority permits, and learner's driving authority permits (permits) to residents of Indiana who cannot provide proof of identity and lawful status in the United States. Provides that permits may not be used for federal identification or any federal purposes. Requires that an individual who holds a permit and operates a motor vehicle must verify that financial responsibility on any motor vehicle that the holder operates is continuously maintained in the amounts required by law. Makes conforming amendments.

Effective: Upon passage; July 1, 2017.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning motor vehicles.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

- 1 SECTION 1. IC 9-13-2-39.7, AS ADDED BY P.L.198-2016,
- 2 SECTION 101, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS
- 3 [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2017]: Sec. 39.7. "Credential" means the
- 4 following forms of documentation issued by the bureau under IC 9-24:
- 5 (1) A driver's license.
- 6 (2) A learner's permit.
- 7 (3) An identification card.
- 8 (4) A photo exempt identification card.
- 9 (5) **A driving authority permit.**
- 10 (6) **A driving authority learner's permit.**
- 11 SECTION 2. IC 9-13-2-41 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
- 12 FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2017]: Sec. 41. (a) "Current driving
- 13 license" means every class and kind of license or permit that evidences
- 14 the privilege to operate a motor vehicle upon the highways of Indiana.
- 15 The term includes a privilege granted by the license.
- 16 (b) **The term does not include a driving authority permit or a**
- 17 **driving authority learner's permit.**

 13 issued by the state authorizing an individual to operate the type of
 14 vehicle for which the permit was issued on public streets, roads, or
 15 highways with certain restrictions. The term includes the following:

- 16 (1) A learner's permit.
- 17 (2) A motorcycle permit.
- 18 (3) A commercial learner's permit.

19 **(4) A driving authority permit.**

20 **(5) A driving authority learner's permit.**

21 SECTION 5. IC 9-21-11-12, AS AMENDED BY P.L.198-2016,
 22 SECTION 366, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS
 23 [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2017]: Sec. 12. A Class B motor driven cycle
 24 may not be operated under any of the following conditions:

- 25 (1) By an individual less than fifteen (15) years of age.
- 26 (2) By an individual who does not have:
 - 27 (A) an unexpired identification card with a Class B motor
 - 28 driven cycle endorsement issued to the individual by the
 - 29 bureau under IC 9-24-16;
 - 30 (B) a valid driver's license **or driving authority permit;** or
 - 31 (C) a valid learner's permit **or driving authority learner's**
 - 32 **permit.**

33 (3) On an interstate highway or a sidewalk.

18 (1) Is a habitual truant under IC 20-33-2-11.

19 (2) Is under at least a second suspension from school for the
20 school year under IC 20-33-8-14 or IC 20-33-8-15.

21 (3) Is under an expulsion from school under IC 20-33-8-14,
22 IC 20-33-8-15, or IC 20-33-8-16.

23 (4) Is considered a dropout under IC 20-33-2-28.5.

24 (b) At least five (5) days before holding an exit interview under
25 IC 20-33-2-28.5, the school corporation shall give notice by certified
26 mail or personal delivery to the student, the student's parent, or the
27 student's guardian that the student's failure to attend an exit interview
28 under IC 20-33-2-28.5 or return to school if the student does not meet
29 the requirements to withdraw from school under IC 20-33-2-28.5 will
30 result in the revocation or denial of the student's:

31 (1) driver's license, ~~or~~ learner's permit, **driving authority permit,**

 19 during the period for which the driving privileges are suspended,
 20 or to an individual whose driver's license **or driving authority**
 21 **permit** has been revoked, until the time the bureau is authorized
 22 under Indiana law to issue the individual a new driver's license **or**
 23 **driving authority permit**.

24 (2) An individual whose learner's permit **or driving authority**

 29 with or suffering from a physical or mental disability or disease

 32 vehicle on a highway.

33 (4) An individual who is unable to understand highway warnings
 34 or direction signs written in the English language.

35 (5) An individual who is required under this article to take an
 36 examination unless:

37 (A) the individual successfully passes the examination; or

38 (B) the bureau waives the examination requirement.

39 (6) An individual who is required under IC 9-25 or any other
 40 statute to deposit or provide proof of financial responsibility and
 41 who has not deposited or provided that proof.

42 (7) An individual when the bureau has good cause to believe that



1 the operation of a motor vehicle on a highway by the individual
2 would be inimical to public safety or welfare.

3 (8) An individual who is the subject of an order issued by:

4 (A) a court under IC 31-16-12-7 (or IC 31-1-11.5-13,
5 IC 31-6-6.1-16, or IC 31-14-12-4 before their repeal); or

6 (B) the Title IV-D agency;

7 ordering that a driver's license or permit not be issued to the
8 individual.

9 (9) An individual who has not presented valid documentary
10 evidence to the bureau of the individual's legal status in the
11 United States, as required by IC 9-24-9-2.5.

12 (10) An individual who does not otherwise satisfy the
13 requirements of this article.

14 (b) An individual subject to epileptic seizures may not be denied a
15 driver's license, ~~or driving authority permit, learner's permit, or~~
16 **driving authority learner's permit** under this section if the individual
17 presents a statement from a licensed physician, on a form prescribed by
18 the bureau, that the individual is under medication and is free from
19 seizures while under medication.

22 [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2017]: Sec. 1. (a) Except as otherwise provided
23 in this article, the bureau shall issue an operator's license to an
24 individual who meets the following conditions:

25 (1) Satisfies the age requirements set forth in section 2.5 of this
26 chapter.

27 (2) Makes proper application to the bureau under IC 9-24-9 upon
28 a form prescribed by the bureau. The form must include an
29 attestation concerning the number of hours of supervised driving
30 practice that the individual has completed if the individual is
31 required under section 2.5 of this chapter to complete a certain
32 number of hours of supervised driving practice in order to receive
33 an operator's license. The:

34 (A) parent or guardian of an applicant less than eighteen (18)
35 years of age; or

36 (B) applicant, if the applicant is at least eighteen (18) years of
37 age;

38 shall attest in writing under penalty of perjury to the time logged
39 in practice driving.

40 (3) Satisfactorily passes the examination and tests required for
41 issuance of an operator's license under IC 9-24-10.

42 (4) Pays the following applicable fee:



- 1 (A) For an individual who is less than seventy-five (75) years
 2 of age, seventeen dollars and fifty cents (\$17.50).
 3 (B) For an individual who is at least seventy-five (75) years of
 4 age but less than eighty-five (85) years of age, eleven dollars
 5 (\$11).
 6 (C) For an individual who is at least eighty-five (85) years of
 7 age, seven dollars (\$7).
- 8 (b) A fee described in subsection (a)(4)(A) shall be distributed as
 9 follows:
 10 (1) Fifty cents (\$0.50) to the state motor vehicle technology fund.
 11 (2) Two dollars (\$2) to the crossroads 2000 fund.
 12 (3) Four dollars and fifty cents (\$4.50) to the motor vehicle
 13 highway account.
 14 (4) For an operator's license issued before July 1, 2019, as
 15 follows:
 16 (A) One dollar and twenty-five cents (\$1.25) to the integrated
 17 public safety communications fund.
 18 (B) Nine dollars and twenty-five cents (\$9.25) to the
 19 commission fund.
 20 (5) For an operator's license issued after June 30, 2019, ten dollars
 21 and fifty cents (\$10.50) to the commission fund.
- 22 (c) A fee described in subsection (a)(4)(B) shall be distributed as
 23 follows:
 24 (1) Fifty cents (\$0.50) to the state motor vehicle technology fund.
 25 (2) One dollar and fifty cents (\$1.50) to the crossroads 2000 fund.

 27 (4) For an operator's license issued before July 1, 2019, as
 28 follows:

 41 follows:

14 **Sec. 1. An individual who is unable to present the valid
15 documentary evidence required by IC 9-24-9-2.5 may apply to the
16 bureau for a driving authority permit.**

17 **Sec. 2. The bureau shall issue a driving authority permit to an
18 individual who meets the following conditions:**

19 **(1) Satisfies the age requirements set forth in section 3 of this
20 chapter.**

21 **(2) Makes proper application to the bureau under IC 9-24-9
22 upon a form prescribed by the bureau. The form must include
23 an attestation concerning the number of hours of supervised
24 driving practice that the individual has completed if the
25 individual is required under section 3 of this chapter to
26 complete a certain number of hours of supervised driving
27 practice in order to receive a driving authority permit. The:**

28 **(A) parent or guardian of an applicant less than eighteen
29 (18) years of age; or**

30 **(B) applicant, if the applicant is at least eighteen (18) years
31 of age;**

32 **shall attest in writing under penalty of perjury to the time
33 logged in practice driving.**

34 **(3) Satisfactorily passes the examination and tests required
35 for issuance of a driving authority permit.**

36 **(4) Pays the fee prescribed by IC 9-24-3-1.**

37 **Sec. 3. (a) An individual must satisfy the requirements set forth
38 in one (1) of the following to receive a driving authority permit:**

39 **(1) The individual meets the following conditions:**

40 **(A) Is at least sixteen (16) years and one hundred eighty
41 (180) days of age.**

42 **(B) Has held a valid driving authority learner's permit for**



- 1 at least one hundred eighty (180) days.
 2 (C) Obtains an instructor's certification that the individual
 3 has satisfactorily completed an approved driver's
 4 education course.
 5 (D) Passes the required examination.
 6 (E) Completes at least fifty (50) hours of supervised driving
 7 practice, of which not less than ten (10) hours are
 8 nighttime driving with:
 9 (i) a licensed instructor or a licensed driver who is at
 10 least twenty-five (25) years of age; or
 11 (ii) the spouse of the individual who is at least twenty-one
 12 (21) years of age.
 13 (2) The individual meets the following conditions:
 14 (A) Is at least sixteen (16) years and two hundred seventy
 15 (270) days of age.
 16 (B) Has held a valid driving authority learner's permit for
 17 at least one hundred eighty (180) days.
 18 (C) Passes the required examination.
 19 (D) Completes at least fifty (50) hours of supervised
 20 driving practice, of which at least ten (10) hours are
 21 nighttime driving, with:
 22 (i) a licensed instructor or a licensed driver who is at
 23 least twenty-five (25) years of age; or
 24 (ii) the spouse of an individual who is at least twenty-one
 25 (21) years of age.
 26 (3) The individual meets the following conditions:
 27 (A) Is at least eighteen (18) years of age.
 28 (B) Has previously been a nonresident of Indiana but, at
 29 the time of application, qualifies as an Indiana resident.
 30 (C) Held a valid driver's license, excluding a learner's
 31 permit or the equivalent, from the state of prior residence.
 32 (D) Passes the required examination.
 33 (b) An applicant who is required to complete at least fifty (50)
 34 hours of supervised driving under subsection (a)(1)(E) or (a)(2)(D)
 35 must submit to the bureau evidence of the time logged in practice
 36 driving.
 37 Sec. 4. A driving authority permit must include a statement on
 38 the face of the permit that indicates that the driving authority
 39 permit may not be accepted by any federal agency for federal
 40 identification or any other federal purpose.
 41 Sec. 5. A driving authority permit allows the holder to operate
 42 a passenger motor vehicle or a truck with a declared gross weight



1 equal to or less than eleven thousand (11,000) pounds.

2 **Sec. 6. An individual who holds a driving authority permit and**
 3 **operates a motor vehicle shall verify that financial responsibility**
 4 **on any motor vehicle that the holder operates is continuously**
 5 **maintained in the amounts required by IC 9-25-4.**

6 **Sec. 7. The bureau shall adopt rules under IC 4-22-2 to**
 7 **implement this chapter.**

8 SECTION 13. IC 9-24-7-1, AS AMENDED BY P.L.198-2016,
 9 SECTION 454, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS
 10 [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2017]: Sec. 1. (a) The bureau shall issue a
 11 learner's permit **or driving authority learner's permit** to an individual
 12 who satisfies the following conditions:

13 (1) Makes a proper application in the form and manner prescribed
 14 by the bureau.

15 (2) Pays a fee under subsection ~~(b)~~ **or (c) or (d)**, as applicable.

16 (3) If less than eighteen (18) years of age, is not ineligible under
 17 IC 9-24-2-1.

18 (4) Has passed a written examination as required under
 19 IC 9-24-10.

20 (5) Either:

21 (A) is at least sixteen (16) years of age; or

22 (B) if at least fifteen (15) years of age but less than sixteen

 34 **operate a passenger motor vehicle or a truck with a declared gross**
 35 **weight equal to or less than eleven thousand (11,000) pounds. An**
 36 **individual who holds a driving authority learner's permit and**
 37 **operates a motor vehicle shall verify that financial responsibility**
 38 **on any motor vehicle that the holder operates is continuously**
 39 **maintained in the amounts required by IC 9-25-4.**

40 ~~(b)~~ **(c)** The fee for a learner's permit issued before January 1, 2017,
 41 is nine dollars and fifty cents (\$9.50). The fee shall be distributed as
 42 follows:



- 1 (1) Fifty cents (\$0.50) to the motor vehicle highway account.
 2 (2) Fifty cents (\$0.50) to the state motor vehicle technology fund.
 3 (3) Two dollars (\$2) to the crossroads 2000 fund.

 32 seat of the motor vehicle by an individual with valid driving

 36 training school described in IC 9-27-6-3(a)(2); or
 37 (B) is a certified driver rehabilitation specialist recognized by

 39 program.
 40 (2) While the holder is participating in practice driving after
 41 having commenced an approved driver education course and is
 42 accompanied in the front seat of the motor vehicle by an



- 1 individual with valid driving privileges who is at least:
 2 (A) twenty-five (25) years of age and related to the applicant
 3 by blood, marriage, or legal status; or
 4 (B) if the licensed individual is the holder's spouse, twenty-one
 5 (21) years of age.
 6 (3) If the holder is not participating in an approved driver
 7 education course, and is less than eighteen (18) years of age, the
 8 holder may participate in practice driving if accompanied in the
 9 front seat of the motor vehicle by an individual who is:
 10 (A) a licensed driver, with valid driving privileges, who is:
 11 (i) at least twenty-five (25) years of age; and
 12 (ii) related to the applicant by blood, marriage, or legal

 17 (C) an individual with valid driving privileges who:
