

### SENATE BILL No. 517

DIGEST OF SB 517 (Updated February 14, 2017 5:03 pm - DI 109)

Citations Affected: IC 4-30; IC 10-17.

**Synopsis:** Distribution of lottery revenues. Requires the state lottery commission to adopt rules to establish a scratch off game to benefit Indiana veterans. Provides that 40% of the profits from a scratch off game that benefits Indiana veterans shall be deposited in the veterans homelessness assistance fund. Establishes the veterans homelessness assistance fund. Requires the department of veterans' affairs to adopt administrative rules for: (1) oversight of; and (2) the awarding of grants to qualified entities from; the veterans homelessness assistance fund. Provides that the scratch off game to benefit veterans and the veterans homelessness assistance fund expire June 30, 2020.

Effective: July 1, 2017.

## **SENATE BILL No. 517**

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning gaming.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. IC 4-30-3-20 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
AS A <b>NEW</b> SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
1, 2017]: Sec. 20. (a) The commission shall adopt rules under
IC 4-22-2, including emergency rules in the manner provided
under IC 4-22-2-37.1, to establish a scratch off game to benefit
veterans.

- (b) The scratch off game described in subsection (a) must be available during the entire calendar year.
- (c) Forty percent (40%) of the profits from the sale of tickets for the scratch off game described in subsection (a) must be deposited in the veterans homelessness assistance fund established by IC 10-17-16-7. This section expires June 30, 2020.

SECTION 2. IC 4-30-10-3 IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2017]: Sec. 3. (a) Each retailer is liable to the commission for any and all tickets accepted or generated by an employee or representative of that retailer. These tickets are considered to have been purchased by the retailer, unless returned to



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the commission within the time and in the manner prescribed by the commission.

- **(b) Except as provided in subsection (c),** all money received by retailers from the sale of lottery tickets, less the amount retained as compensation for the sale of the tickets and the amount paid out as prizes by the retailer, shall be held in trust until its delivery to the commission or electronic transfer to the administrative trust fund.
- (c) Forty percent (40%) of the profits from the sale of tickets for a scratch off game established under IC 4-30-3-20 shall be held in trust until its delivery to the commission for deposit in or electronic transfer to the veterans homelessness assistance fund established by IC 10-17-16-7. This subsection expires June 30, 2020.

SECTION 3. IC 4-30-15-1 IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2017]: Sec. 1. (a) There is created an administrative trust fund to be administered by the commission in accordance with this article.

- **(b) Except as provided in subsection (c),** all money received by the commission shall be deposited into the fund. All money in the fund is continually appropriated to the commission for the purposes specified in this article.
- (c) The commission shall deposit forty percent (40%) of the profits from the sale of tickets for a scratch off game established under IC 4-30-3-20 in the veterans homelessness assistance fund established by IC 10-17-16-7. This subsection expires June 30, 2020.

SECTION 4. IC 10-17-16 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS A **NEW** CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2017]:

### **Chapter 16. Veterans Homelessness Assistance Fund**

- Sec. 1. As used in this chapter, "commission" refers to the Indiana veterans' affairs commission established by IC 10-17-13-4.
- Sec. 2. As used in this chapter, "department" refers to the Indiana department of veterans' affairs established by IC 10-17-1-2.
- Sec. 3. As used in this chapter, "director" refers to the director of veterans' affairs.
- Sec. 4. As used in this chapter, "fund" refers to the veterans homelessness assistance fund established by section 7 of this chapter.
- Sec. 5. As used in this chapter, "qualified entity" means an entity that provides homelessness assistance services to veterans and is exempt from taxation under Section 501 of the Internal



1	Revenue Code.
2	Sec. 6. As used in this chapter, "veteran" means an individual
3	residing in Indiana who:
4	(1) has served in any branch of the armed forces of the United
5	States or their reserves, in the national guard, or in the
6	Indiana national guard; and
7	(2) received a discharge from service under honorable
8	conditions.
9	Sec. 7. (a) The veterans homelessness assistance fund is
10	established to provide grants to qualified entities to be used for
11	services that benefit veterans, including:
12	(1) programs focused on eliminating homelessness, preventing
13	near term homelessness, and providing safe, secure living
14	conditions;
15	(2) assisting veterans in moving out of public housing
16	assistance programs and towards:
17	(A) home ownership; or
18	(B) stable, long term rental status, which may include up
19	to nine (9) months of rental assistance;
20	(3) assisting veterans in finding and using available federal
21	and state resources;
22	(4) providing therapeutic services; and
23	(5) providing job training and job search assistance.
24	(b) The commission shall expend the money in the fund
25	exclusively to provide grants to qualified entities to be used for
26	services as described in subsection (a).
27	(c) The fund shall be administered by the commission.
28	(d) The fund consists of the following:
29	(1) Appropriations made by the general assembly.
30	(2) Donations to the fund.
31	(3) Interest.
32	(4) Money transferred to the fund as described in
33	IC 4-30-16-3(a)(3).
34	(5) Money from any other source authorized or appropriated
35	for the fund.
36	(e) Money in the fund at the end of a state fiscal year does not
37	revert to the state general fund or to any other fund.
38	Sec. 8. The commission shall adopt rules under IC 4-22-2 for the
39	provision of grants under this chapter. The rules adopted under
40	this section must address the following:
41	(1) Application procedures.
42	(2) Eligibility criteria.



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1	(3) Selection procedures.
2	(4) A consideration of the extent to which a qualified entity
3	has used assistance available from other assistance programs
4	before assistance may be provided to the qualified entity from
5	the fund.
6	(5) Department oversight and verification of use of funds
7	received by qualified entities.
8	(6) Other areas in which the department determines that rules
9	are necessary to ensure the uniform administration of the
10	grant program under this chapter.
11	Sec. 9. The director shall establish the capability to receive
12	donations to the fund from the public on the department's Interne
13	web site.
14	Sec. 10. This chapter expires June 30, 2020.



#### COMMITTEE REPORT

Madam President: The Senate Committee on Veterans Affairs and The Military, to which was referred Senate Bill No. 517, has had the same under consideration and begs leave to report the same back to the Senate with the recommendation that said bill be AMENDED as follows:

Page 1, line 7, delete "Beginning January 1, 2018, the scratch off game described" and insert "The scratch off game described in subsection (a) must be available during the entire calendar year.

(c) Forty percent (40%) of the profits from the sale of tickets for the scratch off game described in subsection (a) must be deposited in the veterans homelessness assistance fund established by IC 10-17-16-7. This section expires June 30, 2020.

SECTION 2. IC 4-30-10-3 IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2017]: Sec. 3. Page 1, delete lines 8 through 17.

Page 2, delete lines 1 through 35.

Page 4, after line 23, begin a new paragraph and insert:

"Sec. 10. This chapter expires June 30, 2020.".

Renumber all SECTIONS consecutively.
