**Synopsis:** Government terminology. Prohibits units of government from using the term "free" to describe a payment, good, or service unless the payment, good, or service is privately funded.

11	(6) a political subdivision (as defined in IC 36-1-2-13); and
12	(7) any other unit of state or local government that
13	administers public funds;
14	shall not use the term "free" to describe a payment, good, or
15	service unless the payment, good, or service is funded entirely
16	through private contributions.
