

ENGROSSED SENATE BILL No. 529

DIGEST OF SB 529 (Updated March 21, 2019 10:09 am - DI 77)

Citations Affected: IC 36-1.

Synopsis: Agricultural matters. Provides that a county, city, town, or township may not adopt or continue in effect any ordinance, rule, regulation, or resolution prohibiting the establishment or maintenance of beekeeping, raising chickens, or composting on property that the person owns, rents, or leases.

Effective: July 1, 2019.

ENGROSSED SENATE BILL No. 529

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning local government.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

16	Sec. 2. (a) Except as provided in subsection (b), a unit may not

property that the person owns, rents, or leases.									

- (b) A unit may adopt an ordinance, rule, regulation, or resolution that regulates chickens concerning the number of chickens a person may own and the location of chicken housing on the property.
- Sec. 3. (a) This section does not apply to a composting facility subject to IC 13-20-10.
- (b) Except as provided in subsection (c), a unit may not adopt or continue in effect an ordinance, rule, regulation, or resolution that prohibits a person from composting vegetative matter and other types of organic material that are generated by the person's activities on property that the person owns, rents, or leases.
- (c) A unit may adopt an ordinance, rule, regulation, or resolution that regulates composting vegetative matter and other types of organic material that are generated by the person's activities concerning the maximum composting area a person may operate and the location of the composting on the property.



COMMITTEE REPORT

Madam President: The Senate Committee on Agriculture, to which was referred Senate Bill No. 529, has had the same under consideration and begs leave to report the same back to the Senate with the recommendation that said bill be AMENDED as follows:

Page 1, delete lines 1 through 8, begin a new paragraph and insert: "SECTION 1. IC 14-24-8-0.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2019]: Sec. 0.5. (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) and notwithstanding any other law, a unit (as defined in IC 36-1-2-23) shall not adopt or continue in effect any ordinance, rule, regulation, or resolution prohibiting the establishment or maintenance of honeybees and hives.

(b) This section shall not be construed to restrict the zoning authority of a unit (as defined in IC 36-1-2-23) regarding honeybees and hives.".

Delete the title and insert the following:

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning local government.

Page 1, line 1, delete "IC 14-24-8-0.5" and insert "IC 36-1-28".

Page 1, line 2, delete "SECTION" and insert "CHAPTER".

Page 1, line 3, delete "Sec. 0.5.", begin a new paragraph and insert:

"Chapter 28. Ordinances that Affect Agriculture Sec. 1.".

Page 1, line 4, delete "(as defined in IC 36-1-2-23)".

Page 1, line 5, delete "shall" and insert "may".



- Page 1, line 6, delete "prohibiting the establishment or" and insert "that prohibits a person from beekeeping on property that the person owns, rents, or leases.

- Sec. 3. (a) This section does not apply to a composting facility subject to IC 13-20-10.
- (b) Except as provided in subsection (c), a unit may not adopt or continue in effect an ordinance, rule, regulation, or resolution that prohibits a person from composting vegetative matter and other types of organic material that are generated by the person's activities on property that the person owns, rents, or leases.
