## SENATE ENROLLED ACT No. 529

AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning local government.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. IC 36-1-28 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS A **NEW** CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2019]:

**Chapter 28. Ordinances That Affect Agriculture** 

- Sec. 1. (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) and notwithstanding any other law, a unit may not adopt or continue in effect any ordinance, rule, regulation, or resolution that prohibits a person from beekeeping on property that the person owns, rents, or leases.
- (b) A unit may adopt an ordinance, rule, regulation, or resolution that regulates beekeeping:
  - (1) concerning the number of active bee hives a person may operate and the location of bee hives on the property; and
  - (2) that conforms to standards established by the Apiary Inspectors of America.
