DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Synopsis: Office of health information technology. Creates the office of health information technology within the state department of health to: (1) study and report on certain uses of health information; (2) study and report on incentives for use of electronic health records; and (3) implement, and report on implementation of, certain recommendations for further study and legislation concerning health information technology.

5	(1) Entrepreneurial uses of health information contained in

8	prognosis of a patient.
9	(2) State incentives for health care providers to adopt and
10	maintain electronic health records.

20	Sec. 4. (a) The state health commissioner shall appoint
21	individuals to staff the office, including:
22	(1) a director of the office; and
23	(2) other employees that the state health commissioner
24	determines are necessary.
25	(b) Employees appointed under subsection (a)(2) shall report to
26	the director. The director shall report to the state health
27	commissioner.
28	(c) The director shall oversee the administrative functions of the
29	office.
