## **SENATE BILL No. 547**

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 20-24-8-5; IC 20-24.2-4; IC 20-30-5.

**Synopsis:** School curriculum. Requires each school corporation to include: (1) geography; (2) biology; (3) chemistry; and (4) physics; in its curriculum. Requires each school corporation, charter school, and accredited nonpublic school to include entrepreneurship in its curriculum for grades 1 through 12. Makes conforming amendments. Urges the legislative council to assign to an appropriate study committee the topic of improving science education.

Effective: July 1, 2019.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

12	(1) Whether scientific disciplines, such as chemistry, physics,
13	and biology, should be taught separately at all grade levels.
14	(2) Whether science instruction could be organized at all
15	grade levels such that fundamental concepts in each scientific
16	discipline are taught in a manner that informs later
17	instruction in both that discipline and other disciplines.
18	(3) Any other issue the committee considers relevant to the
19	subject of improving science education.
20	(b) The committee to which the legislative council assigns the
21	topic described in subsection (a) shall consult and collaborate with
22	the department of education in studying the topic and developing
23	recommendations.
24	(c) This SECTION expires July 1, 2021.



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
