DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 12-14-30-3.

Synopsis: Removal of asset limits for SNAP food assistance program. Requires the division of family resources to: (1) implement within the federal Supplemental Nutritional Assistance program (SNAP) an expanded eligibility category, which does not consider an individual's value of assets in determining SNAP eligibility; and (2) notify the United States Department of Agriculture of the implementation of expanded categorical eligibility under SNAP.

Effective: July 1, 2015.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:
