DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 3-11-15.

Synopsis: Voting systems. Requires all voting systems to rely on the retention of paper ballots as a redundant means of verifying or auditing election results. Requires that a voting system permit a voter to examine the paper record of the voter's votes to verify the voter's votes. Provides that after a voter has verified the votes on the paper record, the paper record is the official record of the votes.

Effective: January 1, 2020.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

the unit must incorporate multiple memories in the machine itself and
in the unit's programmable memory devices. To attain a measure of
integrity over the process, an electronic voting system must also
maintain images of each ballot that is cast so that records of individual
ballots are maintained by a subsystem independent and distinct from
the main vote detection, diagnostic, processing, and reporting path.

SECTION 3. IC 3-11-15-43, AS AMENDED BY P.L.128-2015, SECTION 198, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2020]: Sec. 43. (a) The audit record provisions in this chapter are essential to the complete recording of election operations and reporting of the vote tally. This list of audit records must reflect all of the idiosyncrasies of a system.

- (b) As required by 52 U.S.C. 21081, The voting system must do the following:
 - (1) Produce a permanent paper record with a manual audit capacity for the system. and
 - (2) Permit the voter to examine a paper record of the voter's votes to verify the voter's votes. A voter may not keep the paper record produced under this subsection.
 - (2) (3) Provide the voter with an opportunity to change the ballot or correct any error. before
 - (4) Provide that after the voter has verified the voter's votes, the permanent paper record is produced: the official record of the voter's votes.
- (c) The paper record produced under subsection (b) must be made available as described in subsection (b)(4) is an official record for a recount or contest conducted with respect to any election in which the voting system was used.
