DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 25-0.5; IC 25-23.6-12; IC 25-41; IC 35-52-25-66.

Synopsis: Licensure of behavior analysts. Provides for licensure of behavior analysts and assistant behavior analysts. (Current law provides for certification of behavior analysts and assistant behavior analysts.) Sets forth exemptions. Makes conforming changes.

SENATE BILL No. 612

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning professions and occupations.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 25-0.5-1-2.7 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA

9	analysts and assistant behavior analysts.
10	SECTION 3. IC 25-23.6-12 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
11	AS A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
12	JULY 1, 2019]:
13	Chapter 12. Behavior Analyst and Assistant Behavior Analyst
14	Licensure
15	Sec. 1. The practice of applied behavior analysis in Indiana is
16	hereby declared to affect the health, safety, and welfare of the
17	citizens of Indiana and to be subject to regulation to protect the



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public from the practice of applied behavior analysis by unqualified persons and unprofessional, unethical, or harmful conduct by behavior analysis practitioners.

Sec. 2. As used in this chapter, "assistant behavior analyst" means an individual who is certified by the certifying entity as a board certified assistant behavior analyst (BCaBA) and who meets the other requirements specified in section 13 of this chapter.

Sec. 3. As used in this chapter, "behavior analyst" means an individual who is certified by the certifying entity as a board certified behavior analyst (BCBA) and who meets the other requirements specified in section 12 of this chapter.

12 Sec. 4. As used in this chapter, "behavior technician" means a 13 paraprofessional who practices under the close, ongoing supervision of a behavior analyst or assistant behavior analyst. The 14 15 behavior technician does not design assessment or intervention 16 plans or procedures but delivers services as assigned by the 17 supervisor responsible for the behavior technician's work. The 18 term includes an individual who is credentialed as a registered 19 behavior technician by the certifying entity.

Sec. 5. As used in this chapter, "board" refers to the Indiana
behavior analyst licensing board established by section 8 of this
chapter.

Sec. 6. As used in this chapter, "certifying entity" refers to the
Behavior Analyst Certification Board, Inc. (BACB) that is a
national certifying entity.

Sec. 7. (a) As used in this chapter, "practice of applied behavior
 analysis" means the design, implementation, and evaluation of
 instructional and environmental modifications to produce socially
 significant improvements in human behavior. The term includes
 the following:

31 (1) Empirical identification of functional relations between
32 behavior and environmental factors, known as functional
33 assessment and analysis.

(2) Applied behavior analysis interventions based on scientific
 research and direct and indirect observation and
 measurement of behavior and environment.

37 (3) Use of contextual factors, motivating operations,
38 antecedent stimuli, positive reinforcement, and other
39 procedures to help individuals develop new behaviors,
40 increase or decrease existing behaviors, and emit behaviors
41 under specific environmental conditions.

(b) The term does not include the following:



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3 1 (1) Psychological testing. 2 (2) Diagnosis of mental or physical disorders. 3 (3) Psychotherapy. 4 (4) Cognitive therapy. 5 (5) Psychoanalysis. 6 (6) Counseling. 7 Sec. 8. The Indiana behavior analyst licensing board is 8 established. 9 Sec. 9. The board shall do the following: 10 (1) Issue licenses to individuals who meet the requirements 11 specified in this chapter. 12 (2) Adopt rules. 13 (3) Establish fees necessary to implement this chapter. 14 (4) Investigate all complaints relating to the practice of 15 applied behavior analysis by any behavior analyst, assistant 16 behavior analyst, or any other person alleged to be violating 17 any of the provisions of this chapter. 18 Sec. 10. (a) The board consists of five (5) voting members 19 appointed by the governor as follows: 20 (1) Three (3) board certified behavior analysts who are 21 licensed under this chapter. 22 (2) One (1) board certified assistant behavior analyst who is 23 licensed under this chapter. 24 (3) One (1) public member who is not a professional behavior 25 analyst. 26 The initial appointments shall include three (3) board certified 27 behavior analysts who are eligible for a license under this chapter, 28 one (1) board certified assistant behavior analyst who is eligible for 29 a license under this chapter, and one (1) public member who is not 30 a professional behavior analyst. The board certified behavior 31 analyst and board certified assistant behavior analyst members 32 must apply for a license as soon as feasible. Subsequently, the 33 board shall consist of three (3) licensed behavior analysts, one (1) 34 licensed assistant behavior analyst, and one (1) public member. 35 (b) The membership of the board shall be inclusive and reflect 36 the racial, gender, geographic, urban, rural, and economic 37 diversity of Indiana. Each member shall serve a three (3) year 38 term, with initial terms being staggered so that one (1) member 39 serves an initial term of one (1) year, two (2) members serve initial 40 terms of two (2) years, and two (2) members serve initial terms of 41 three (3) years, as provided by the appointing authority. The public 42 member shall be a person who is not and never has been a member



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of the profession licensed or regulated under this chapter or the 1 2 spouse of such a person, and who does not have and never has had 3 a material financial interest in the practice of applied behavior 4 analysis. 5 (c) Members of the board shall be appointed by the governor 6 upon recommendations submitted by the Hoosier Association for 7 Behavior Analysis and any other group deemed appropriate by the 8 governor. Terms and vacancies shall be filled as follows: 9 (1) Any vacancy occurring other than by expiration of a term 10 shall be filled for the remainder of the unexpired term by 11 appointment by the governor upon recommendation of the 12 board. 13 (2) A member may not serve more than two (2) successive 14 three (3) year terms. 15 (3) A member shall serve until a successor is appointed and 16 assumes office. 17 (4) Members of the board shall not be remunerated, but shall 18 be paid out of the funds of the board the minimum salary per 19 diem provided by IC 4-10-11-2.1(b) for each day of 20 attendance at board meetings. 21 Sec. 11. (a) The board shall meet at least twice annually and 22 may meet at such other times as necessary, at the call of the chair 23 or by a majority of the members, to complete the business 24 required. 25 (b) Three (3) members of the board shall constitute a quorum. 26 (c) The board shall elect a chair from among its membership on 27 an annual basis. 28 Sec. 12. An individual who applies for a license as a behavior 29 analyst must meet the following requirements: 30 (1) Furnish satisfactory evidence to the board that the 31 individual is certified by the certifying entity as a certified 32 behavior analyst. 33 (2) Submit to a national criminal history background check 34 under IC 25-1-1.1-4 and furnish satisfactory evidence to the 35 board that the individual does not have a conviction for a 36 crime that has a direct bearing on the individual's ability to 37 practice competently. 38 (3) Furnish satisfactory evidence to the board that the 39 individual has not been the subject of a disciplinary action by 40 a licensing or certification agency of another state or 41 jurisdiction on the grounds that the individual was not able to 42 practice behavior analysis without endangering the public.

25	(c) An assistant behavior analyst must submit to the board on
26	an annual basis a written record of the supervision provided to the
27	assistant behavior analyst by a behavior analyst licensed under this
28	chapter.
29	Sec. 14. An individual who is licensed under this chapter shall
30	comply with the requirements of the Professional and Ethical
31	Compliance Code for Behavior Analysts published by the
32	certifying entity.
33	Sec. 15. A license shall be granted for a period of two (2) years.
34	Prior to expiration of a license, the license may be renewed upon
35	submission of an application for renewal, board verification of
36	current certification by the certifying entity, and payment of any
37	renewal fee established by the board.
38	Sec. 16. This chapter may not be construed to limit the use of
39	applied behavior analysis techniques by a person who does not use
40	a title specified in section 18 of this chapter and is one (1) of the
41	following:



1	(1) A licensed or certified health care professional acting
2	within the scope of the person's license or certificate and
3	within the person's training.
4	(2) A student, an intern, or a trainee pursuing a course of
5	study to gain licensure under this chapter in an accredited
6	eligible postsecondary educational institution or training
7	institution.
8	(3) A person who is not a resident of Indiana if the person
9	performs the services in Indiana for not more than five (5)
10	days in any one (1) month or fifteen (15) days within any one
11	(1) calendar year and the person is authorized to perform
12	such services under the laws of the state or country in which
13	the person resides.
14	(4) A behavior technician, or a family member implementing
15	a plan within the home, who acts under the extended
16	authority and direction of a behavior analyst or assistant
17	behavior analyst licensed under this chapter.
18	Sec. 17. If the board determines that:
19	(1) a person possesses a valid license from another jurisdiction
20	to perform acts that require a license under this chapter; and
21	(2) the jurisdiction issuing the license imposes substantially
22	equal requirements on applicants for the license as are
23	imposed on applicants for an Indiana license;
24	the board may issue a license to perform those acts in Indiana to
25	that person upon payment of the licensure fee.
26	Sec. 18. (a) The practice of applied behavior analysis by
27	unlicensed individuals is prohibited unless they are exempted in
28	section 16 of this chapter.
29	(b) An individual may not:
30	(1) profess to be a licensed behavior analyst or licensed
31	assistant behavior analyst; or
32	(2) use the initials "LBA" or "LABA" or any other words,
33	letters, abbreviations, or insignia indicating or implying that
34	the individual is a licensed behavior analyst or licensed
35	assistant behavior analyst;
36	unless the individual holds a license under this chapter.
37	Sec. 19. An individual who violates this chapter commits a Class
38	C infraction.
39	SECTION 4. IC 25-41 IS REPEALED [EFFECTIVE JULY 1,
40	2019]. (BEHAVIOR ANALYSTS).
