Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. [EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE] (a) The definitions

3	(b) The legislative council is urged to assign to the appropriate
4	study committee the task of updating the progress of the study
5	described in HEA 1370-2016.
6	(c) The progress update described in subsection (b) must
7	address the progress that has been made to ensure that a teacher
8	who teaches or wishes to teach a dual credit course remains
9	appropriately licensed, including the progress towards licensure in
10	each subject area taught by a teacher described in this subsection
11	(d) This SECTION expires December 31, 2019.
