SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION No. 4

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION commending the Indiana 1 2 Department of Transportation on the management practices of the innovative Hoosier Roadside Heritage Program. 3 Whereas, The roadside vegetation management practices 4 of Indiana and the federal government aim to secure motorist 5 safety, reduce the presence of noxious weeds, and stabilize 6 the soil to complement good soil and water conservation 7 practices; 8

- 9 Whereas, State and local highway departments are facing
 10 severe budget shortfalls;
- 11 Whereas, Native forbs and grasses are less likely to 12 encroach onto roads than invasive species such as kudzu;
- Whereas, Native forbs and grasses are best adapted to
 local conditions and thus require less active management,
 reducing the need to replant, weed, and mow the areas
 adjacent to the road;
- Whereas, Integrated vegetation management practices
 reduce the cost of maintaining roadside vegetation, with the
 Hoosier Roadside Heritage program saving Indiana \$45 per
 acre a year in maintenance costs;
- Whereas, Pollinators such as bees, birds, bats, and
 butterflies are suffering drastic population loss, due in part
 to habitat loss;



Whereas, Pollinators are vital to American agriculture and 1 2 are responsible for one out of every three bites of food we 3 eat: Whereas, A diverse pollinator population is necessary to 4 maintain the diversity of our plant life and food supply; 5 Enhancing pollinator 6 Whereas. populations on rights-of-way can result in improved pollination for 7 neighboring lands, including agriculture and wildlife 8 ecosystems; 9 Whereas, Sound wildlife ecosystems help support Indiana's 10 *\$1.7 billion a year outdoor recreation industry; and* 11 Whereas, Highway rights-of-way that are kept in a native 12 state sequester carbon in the soil, and reduced mowing 13 14 lowers greenhouse gasses, both of which help to prevent climate change: Therefore, 15 Be it resolved by the Senate 16 of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana, 17 the House of Representatives concurring: 18 SECTION 1. That the Indiana General Assembly commends the 19 20 Indiana Department of Transportation for its innovative Hoosier Roadside Heritage Program, which saves taxpayer dollars, improves 21 22 the environment, and supports agriculture production. SECTION 2. That the Indiana General Assembly further encourages 23 the Indiana Department of Transportation to work with local 24 governments and conservation groups to promote Hoosier Roadside 25 Heritage Program maintenance practices throughout Indiana. 26 SECTION 3. That copies of this resolution be transmitted by the 27 Secretary of the Senate to the Indiana Department of Transportation. 28
