1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION encouraging physical
2	therapists practicing in the state of Indiana to do their part in
3	creating public awareness of physical therapy's role in reducing
4	the opioid epidemic and the treatment of chronic pain.
5	Whereas, One in four individuals who receive long-term
6	prescription opioids for non-cancer pain in primary care
7	settings battle addiction, and 91 Americans die every day from
8	an opioid overdose;
9	Whereas, Individuals who are addicted to prescription
10	opioid painkillers are 40 times more likely to become addicted
11	to heroin;
12	Whereas, There has been a 200% increase in the rate of
13	overdose deaths involving opioid pain relievers and heroin
14	since 2000;
15	Whereas, Indiana exceeded all but eight states in the
16	number of pain prescriptions written per 100 people in 2012,
17	indicating there were enough opioid prescriptions for every
18	Hoosier to have his/her own bottle of pain pills;
19	Whereas, In 2016 in Indiana, opioid pain relievers were
20	responsible for the deaths of 488 individuals;
21	Whereas, The American Physical Therapy Association
22	declares physical therapy as a safe and effective alternative for
23	the treatment of pain and enhancement of health, well-being,

1 *and quality of life through movement and education;*

2 Whereas, The Indiana Chapter of the American Physical 3 Therapy Association is participating in the #ChoosePT 4 campaign to advocate for physical therapy as an alternative 5 treatment to opioid prescriptions for treating chronic pain 6 rather than masking the pain;

7 Whereas The #ChoosePT campaign emphasizes the 8 importance of therapeutic alliance with patients to create an 9 environment where patients feel heard when describing their 10 pain, and also are willing to listen to education and risk factors 11 regarding long-term use of opioids and discuss current or 12 potential substance abuse behaviors; and

Whereas, The #ChoosePT campaign identifies resources,
such as pain profiles, to develop a plan of care to treat patient
pain and determine realistic functional goals based on patient
presentation: Therefore,

Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly
of the State of Indiana, the House of Representatives concurring:

19 SECTION 1. That the Indiana General Assembly 20 encourages physical therapists practicing in the state of Indiana 21 to do their part in creating public awareness of physical 22 therapy's role in reducing the opioid epidemic and the treatment 23 of chronic pain. #ChoosePT.

Chapter of the American Physical Therapy Association.
