## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION No. \_\_\_\_

1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION honoring Kyle Schwarber for
2	his baseball career accomplishments.
3	Whereas, Kyle Schwarber was born on March 5, 1993, to
4	Greg and Donna Schwarber, and he attended Middletown High
5	School in Middletown, Ohio;
6	Whereas, During his four years of high school, Schwarber
7	hit .408 with 18 home runs and 103 runs batted in (RBIs);
8	Whereas, Schwarber attended Indiana University in
9	Bloomington, Indiana, where he played baseball for the
10	Indiana Hoosiers;
11	Whereas, As a freshman at Indiana University in 2012,
12	Schwarber was named a freshman All-American by Louisville
13	Slugger and the Collegiate Baseball Newspaper after hitting
14	.300/.390/.513 with eight home runs and 47 RBIs;
15	Whereas, As a sophomore in 2013, Schwarber hit
16	.366/.456/.647 with 18 home runs and 54 RBIs in 61 games,
17	and he was named a first-team All-American by the National
18	Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA);
19	Whereas, Schwarber played for the United States collegiate
20	national team during the summer between his junior and senior
21	year of college;

1	Whereas, As a junior at Indiana University, Schwarber
2	batted .348/.456/.643 with 13 home runs, and he was a finalist
3	for the Johnny Bench Award;
4	Whereas, Schwarber was drafted by the Chicago Cubs in
5	the first round, fourth overall, in the 2014 Major League
6	Baseball draft, and he signed on June 11, 2014;
7	Whereas, Upon being drafted, MLB.com analyst Bernie
8	Pleskoff profiled Schwarber as a "game-changing" power-
9	hitter, and ESPN's Keith Law echoed a similar sentiment in his
10	draft profile, noting, "Scwarber might have the most raw power
11	of any prospect in the class";
12	Whereas, Schwarber made his professional debut with the
13	Boise Hawks three days later, going 3-4 with a home run and
14	three RBIs, and the Cubs then promoted him to the Kane
15	County Cougars of the Class A Midwest League and the
16	Daytona Cubs of the Class A-Advanced Florida State League
17	before the end of the season;
18	Whereas, Schwarber began the 2015 season with the
19	Double-A Tennessee Smokies of the Southern League, and in
20	July 2015, he played in the All-Star Futures Game, where he
21	was named the MVP of the game after hitting a go-ahead two-
22	run triple for Team USA;
23	Whereas, The Cubs promoted Schwarber to the major
24	leagues on June 16, 2015, to serve as a designated hitter for six
25	games during interleague play;
26	Whereas, The Cubs sent Schwarber to the Triple-A Iowa
27	Cubs of the Pacific Coast League after the six games, and on
28	July 16, 2015, Schwarber was recalled from Triple-A Iowa, to
29	rejoin the Cubs due to an injury to catcher Miguel Montero;
30	Whereas, On July 21, 2015, in a 5-4 extra-inning victory
31	over the Cincinnati Reds, Schwarber hit a game-tying 2-run
32	homer in the ninth inning and a solo go-ahead home run in the
33	ton of the 13th inning to give the Cubs the lead:



1	Whereas, Schwarber's three multihomer games are the most
2	for a Cub rookie in his first 51 games played since 1914, and he
3	finished the 2015 regular season having played 69 games,
4	recording a .246 batting average with 16 home runs, 52 runs
5	scored, and 43 RBIs;
6	Whereas, Despite having been injured in an outfield
7	collision in April 2016, the Cubs added Schwarber to their
8	roster for the 2016 World Series, and started him in Game 1 as
9	their designated hitter;
10	Whereas, Schwarber hit a double off the right-field wall in
11	the 4th inning of Game 1, and he became the first major league
12	position player in baseball history to get his first hit of the
13	season during the World Series;
14	Whereas, Schwarber and the Cubs defeated the Indians in
15	seven games to claim the Cubs' first World Series championship
16	in 108 years;
17	Whereas, During the World Series, Schwarber recorded
18	seven hits, including one double, two RBIs, and one stolen base
19	while batting for .412 and maintaining a .500 on-base
20	percentage; and
21	Whereas, It is fitting that the Indiana General Assembly
22	honor Kyle Schwarber on his baseball career accomplishments.
23	Therefore,
24	Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly
25	of the State of Indiana, the House of Representatives concurring:
26	SECTION 1. That the Indiana General Assembly honors
27	Kyle Schwarber on his baseball career accomplishments.
28	SECTION 2. The Secretary of the Senate is hereby directed
29	to transmit a copy of this Resolution to Kyle Schwarber, and
30	Fred Glass, Director of Athletics at Indiana University.
