4	Whereas, On Saturday March 7, 2015, the Princeton
5	High School girls basketball team captured the 2014-2015
6	IHSAA Class 3A state championship title in Bankers Life
7	Fieldhouse in downtown Indianapolis;
8	Whereas, This win gave the Princeton Tigers their last in
9	a 26-game winning streak;
0	Whereas, Princeton Junior Jackie Young scored a record
1	36 points, grabbed 12 rebounds, had 6 assists and 4 steals to
2	boost the Tigers to a 72-44 victory over the Tippecanoe
3	Valley Vikings;
4	Whereas, With this win, the Princeton Tigers tied the
5	record for most points scored and established a 28 point
6	margin of victory, the largest ever in a Class 3A
7	championship game;
8	Whereas, Young's 36 points represented a new record for
9	Class 3A and for all classes since the advent of the multiple-
0	class system in 1997-1998;

1	Whereas, As the state's second-leading scorer this season
2	with a 31.9 average per game, Young also surpassed the
3	1,000 point mark this season, totaling 1,003 points to become
4	the first girl to reach that milestone and only the fifth player
5	in Indiana high school basketball history to do so;
6	Whereas, Young also broke the record for most field
7	goals made by an individual by sinking 15 of her shots;
8	Whereas, Brooke James also scored in the double-digits
9	in the state final, totaling 15 points;
10	Whereas, James scored the final 13 points of the first half
11	to push the Tigers to a 38-22 halftime lead, breaking the
12	record for most points scored in one half;
13	Whereas, The Tigers were ranked fourth by the ICGSA
14	and finished their season at 30-1;
15	Whereas, This is the first state title for the Princeton girls
16	basketball team and the second in school history, joining the
17	2009 3A boys basketball state title team; and
18	Whereas, It is fitting that the Indiana General Assembly
19	gives special recognition to the Princeton High School girls
20	basketball team for its hard work and perseverance in
21	capturing the 2014-2015 IHSAA Class 3A state title:
