## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION No. 30

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION urging the legislative 1 2 council to assign to the appropriate committee the topic of redistricting issues. 3 4 Whereas, The Indiana General Assembly will establish new state legislative districts and congressional districts in 2021 5 following the 2020 United States decennial census of Indiana; 6 7 Whereas, While traditional redistricting criteria have not addressed partisanship, several recent federal cases reviewing 8 redistricting plans enacted in Wisconsin, Maryland, and North 9 Carolina have focused on whether and when it is possible to 10 bring a claim that drawing districts to the advantage of one 11 political party is unconstitutional; and 12 Whereas, The Indiana General Assembly needs to study these 13 recent developments and other relevant information concerning 14 redistricting law, technology, and process in preparation for 15 the 2021 redistricting cycle: Therefore, 16 Be it resolved by the Senate 17 of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana, 18 the House of Representatives concurring: 19 SECTION 1. That the legislative council is urged to assign 20 the following topics to the appropriate committee: 21 (1) The study of recent federal court decisions discussing 22 the statistical analysis of demographic and political data 23 for the testing or validation of redistricting criteria. 24 (2) The study of the impact of noncontiguous precincts on 25 the redistricting process. 26
