- A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION urging the Legislative Council to assign to a study committee the topic of veterans benefits. 1
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1	Whereas, The Indiana Department of Veterans Affairs (IDVA) is
2	committed to ensuring Hoosier veterans, guardsmen, and qualified
3	family members or survivors who are eligible for benefits, receive the
4	maximum benefits allowed;
5	Whereas, Current national rankings place Indiana near the
6	bottom in most every critical category concerning veterans affairs,
7	including 48th in total expenditures, compensation, and pension, 47th
8	in educational rehabilitation, and 39th for medical care delivery per
9	veteran;
10	Whereas, The primary drivers of the numbers of veterans
l 1	receiving compensation are certified application rate, beneficiary
12	population composition, and adjudication process follow through to
13	include any requests for additional information from the Department
14	of Veterans Affairs (VA);
15	Whereas, The average award level for similar disabilities varies
16	across the states, and is most likely due to policies and levels of
17	training at VA regional offices. The number of beneficiaries with
18	maximum awards also drives variation across the states;
19	Whereas, States that present fully developed and complete files to
20	the VA and follow through to the adjudication process are more
21	successful;
22	Whereas, A key to maximizing use of the VA's emerging digital
23	technologies is to eliminate Indiana's use of paper in the application
24	process to access VA benefits. Indiana is one of the few states that do
25	not have an information technology (IT) system that is bi-directional
26	with the Veterans Benefits Administration (VBA); and
27	Whereas, Indiana must transform its application process to
28	eliminate these significant disadvantages in how the IDVA develops,
29	presents, and follows up on applications: Therefore,
30	Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly
31	of the State of Indiana, the House of Representatives concurring:
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32	SECTION 1. That the Legislative Council is urged to assign to a
33	study committee the topic of veterans benefits.
34	SECTION 2. That the committee, if the topic is assigned to it, shall
35	be charged with studying areas including, but not limited to, the
36	following:



1	(a) How transforming Indiana's veterans benefits services can
2	increase those benefits to veterans and beneficiaries in compensation
3	and pensions, education, medical care, and other areas.
4	(b) How Indiana compares to other states in each component of
5	benefits, as reported annually by the Veterans Benefits Administration
6	(VBA), including, but not limited to:
7	(1) Total expenditures, compensation, and pensions;
8	(2) Education; and
9	(3) Medical and related care.
10	(c) How Indiana's structure of assisting beneficiaries in obtaining
11	benefits and tools may be restructured. Specifically, the following
12	areas shall be reviewed:
13	(1) Management, organization, staffing, and information
14	technology;
15	(2) Education;
16	(3) Employment;
17	(4) Compensation, pension, and other benefits; and
18	(5) Health care education and delivery.
19	SECTION 3. That the committee, if the topic is assigned to it, shall
20	operate under the direction of the Legislative Council, and shall issue
21	a final report when directed to do so by the Council.
22	SECTION 4. The Secretary of the Senate is hereby directed to
23	transmit a copy of this Resolution to the Legislative Council.
