1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION urging the legislative council to assign the topic of the prescription of psychotropic medication to 2 3 children under the care and supervision of the department of child 4 services to the appropriate committee. 5 Whereas, After suffering abuse and neglect, foster children often need therapy and medical assistance; 6 7 Whereas, Children in foster care are prescribed psychotropic medication at a higher rate than children who 8 9 are not in foster care; and 10 Whereas, Since no group of children is more likely to be prescribed psychotropic medications than those in foster 11 care, special care should be taken to ensure their safety: 12 Therefore, 13 14 Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana, 15 the House of Representatives concurring: 16 17 SECTION 1. That the legislative council is urged to assign the topic of the prescription of psychotropic medication to children under the 18 care and supervision of the department of child services to the 19 appropriate committee. 20 21 SECTION 2. That if the topic is assigned to the appropriate committee, the committee should also study the use and administration 22 of psychotropic medication and the development of a process requiring 23 consent of the department of child services for new prescriptions 24
