1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION honoring Judge John G.
2	Baker upon his retirement from the Indiana Court of Appeals.
3	Whereas, After serving for 31 years as a member of the
4	Indiana Court of Appeals, Judge John G. Baker will retire from
5	the bench July 31, 2020;
6	Whereas, Judge Baker grew up in Aurora, Indiana, attained
7	the rank of Eagle Scout, and graduated from the Culver
8	Military Academy;
9	Whereas, Judge Baker received a Bachelor of Arts degree
10	in History from Indiana University in 1968, a Juris Doctor
11	degree from the Indiana University School of
12	Law-Bloomington in 1971, and a Master of Laws degree from
13	the University of Virginia in 1995;
14	Whereas, Judge Baker practiced law with the firm of Baker,
15	Barnhart, and Andrews, before serving as judge of the Monroe
16	County and Monroe Superior Courts for 13 1/2 years,
17	disposing of more than 15,000 cases as a trial court judge;
18	Whereas, In 1989, Judge Baker was named to the Court of
19	Appeals by Governor Evan Bayh, and he was retained on the
20	Court by election in 1992, 2002, and 2012;
21	Whereas, During his time on the Court of Appeals, Judge
22	Baker wrote more than 5,000 majority opinions for the Court,
23	and served as Chief Judge of the Court of Appeals from 2007
24	through 2010;

1	Whereas, Judge Baker also spent time in the classroom,
2	teaching for 33 years at the Indiana University–Bloomington
3	School of Public and Environmental Affairs, teaching a class
4	for foreign lawyers at the Indiana University Robert H.
5	McKinney School of Law for 10 years, and serving on the
6	faculties of the Indiana Judicial College, Indiana Continuing
7	Legal Education Forum, and the National Institute of Trial
8	Advocacy;
9	Whereas, Long interested in court and judicial reform and
10	history, Judge Baker has been a member of the Strategic
11	Planning Committee of the Judicial Conference of Indiana
12	since its inception to help improve Hoosiers' access to Indiana
13	courts and their quality of experience in dealing with the
14	courts;
15	Whereas, Judge Baker is a member of the American,
16	Indiana State, Monroe County, Boone County, and Indianapolis
17	Bar Associations, and served on the Indiana Judges
18	Association Board of Managers from 1979 through 2011,
19	including as president from January 1987 through June 1989;
20	Whereas, Off the bench, Judge Baker served as a Captain
21	in the U.S. Army Reserves, serves on the Board of Trustees of
22	Garrett-Evangelical Theological Seminary, and remains active
23	in his community, church, and the Boy Scouts of America;
24	Whereas, Judge Baker and his wife are the proud parents
25	of six children and grandparents of eleven;
26	Whereas, Judge Baker has served with distinction during
27	his more than four decade career as a member of the Indiana
28	Court of Appeals and the Monroe County trial courts; and
29	Whereas, It is fitting that the Indiana General Assembly
30	honors Judge Baker for his immeasurable contributions to the
31	Indiana Judiciary and legal community: Therefore,

4	SECTION 1. That the Indiana General Assembly honors
5	Judge John G. Baker upon his retirement from the Indiana
