MADAM PRESIDENT:

I offer the following resolution and move its adoption:

1	A SENATE RESOLUTION honoring Indiana's women
2	veterans.
3	Whereas, Women are an essential part of the United States
4	military and the profession of arms, having served throughout
5	the history of the United States of America;
6	Whereas, Many women, unable to serve lawfully in the
7	profession of arms, provided critical support to the United
8	States Army during the American Revolutionary War as nurses,
9	seamstresses, and cooks;
10	Whereas, The U.S. Army reports that women did fight
11	alongside their husbands in combat or disguised themselves as
12	men in order to serve, and women took an active role providing
13	the military with intelligence on enemy troop movements
14	throughout the colonies and along the frontier;
15	Whereas, The U.S. Army reports that women served once
16	again during the Civil War in critical roles as nurses and aides
17	in addition to an estimated 400 women who secretly enlisted as

soldiers to fight in the Union or Confederate armies;

1	Whereas, The U.S. Army established a permanent Nurse
2	Corps in 1901, recognizing the skilled role of nurses in the
3	military, especially during the Spanish-American War and ar
4	outbreak of typhoid fever, when an estimated 1,500 contrac
5	nurses served in Army and Navy general hospitals and
6	throughout the Northern Hemisphere during the war effort;
7	Whereas, An estimated 25,000 women between the ages o
8	21 and 69 served overseas during World War I, prompting
9	increased roles for women in the military in the Army, Navy
10	and Marines as the United States' involvement in World War I.
11	began in earnest;
12	
13	Whereas, During World War II, more than 60,000 Army
14	nurses served around the world, with an estimated 140,000
15	women serving in the U.S. Army and the Women's Army Corps,
16	Whereas, The U.S. Army reports that more than 1,000
17	women flew aircraft for the Women Airforce Service Pilots, a
18	civilian women pilots organization, during that same period;
19	Whereas, The role of women in the United States military
20	and their voluntary service continued to grow over the decades
21	especially in nursing, and an estimated 170,000 women served
22	on active duty by 1980 according to the Women in Military
23	Service Memorial Foundation;
24	Whereas, The United States, acknowledging the value and
25	strength of women in the military, offered females the
26	opportunity to serve in combat roles throughout the armed
27	forces in 2015; and
28	Whereas, Women today serve and fight alongside their
29	fellow soldiers, sailors, airmen, marines, and guardians or
30	behalf of the United States of America: Therefore,
31	Be it resolved by the Senate of the
32	General Assembly of the State of Indiana:
