A SENATE RESOLUTION reaffirming Indiana's commitment to strengthening and deepening the sister ties between Indiana and Taiwan, reaffirming support for the Taiwan Relations Act by urging all enterprises in Indiana to refer to Taiwan as Taiwan, supporting the signing of trade agreements between Taiwan and the United States, encouraging Taiwan's meaningful participation in international organizations, and strengthening the education linkages with Taiwan.

## SENATE RESOLUTION \_\_\_\_

### MADAM PRESIDENT:

I offer the following resolution and move its adoption:

1	A SENATE RESOLUTION reaffirming Indiana's
2	commitment to strengthening and deepening the sister ties
3	between Indiana and Taiwan, reaffirming support for the
4	Taiwan Relations Act by urging all enterprises in Indiana to
5	refer to Taiwan as Taiwan, supporting the signing of trade
6	agreements between Taiwan and the United States, encouraging
7	Taiwan's meaningful participation in international
8	organizations, and strengthening the education linkages with

10	Whereas, In March 1979, the United States (U.S.) Congress
11	passed the Taiwan Relations Act to authorize the continuation
12	of commercial, cultural, and other relations with Taiwan;
13	Whereas, In November 1979, Indiana became the first state
14	to formalize a sister-state relationship with Taiwan, when State
15	Senator John M. Guy and Lin Yang-kang, Chairman of Taiwan
16	Province, signed the first Taiwan-Indiana accord;
17	Whereas, In 2005, Mitch Daniels became the first sitting
18	Indiana Governor to visit Taiwan, and he promised to further
19	strengthen bilateral friendships and relations;



Whereas, The economic and cultural ties between Indiana and Taiwan have developed as promised with Taiwan being Indiana's sixth-largest export market in Asia in 2021 - receiving more than \$240 million in Indiana goods - and its people sharing the same values of freedom, democracy, human rights, respect for the rule of law, peace, and prosperity as the people of the State of Indiana;

Whereas, The Indiana Department of Education and Taiwan's Department of International and Cross-Strait Education entered into a Memorandum of Understanding on education to strengthen education linkages between Indiana and Taiwan;

Whereas, The ties between Taiwan and the United States are strong, as Taiwan is the U.S.'s eighth largest goods trading partner, with two-way trade in goods and services totaling \$114 billion in 2021;

Whereas, Trade agreements between Taiwan and the U.S. would make this important relationship even stronger, as it would increase exports to Taiwan from the U.S. as a whole, and Indiana in particular, and allow greater bilateral investment and technical collaboration through tariff reduction and other trade facilitation measures;

Whereas, In June 2021, the U.S. and Taiwan held the 11th Trade and Investment Framework Agreement (TIFA) Council meeting, at the conclusion of which there was a commitment to intensified engagement and a hope to gradually move towards a free trade agreement;

Whereas, The Office of the U.S. Trade Representative and the Taipei Economic and Cultural Representative Office in the U.S. launched the U.S.-Taiwan Initiative on 21st-Century Trade on June 1, 2022, and began holding in-person negotiating rounds from January 14-17, 2023, but no comprehensive trade agreements have yet been made between the U.S. and Taiwan;

Whereas, During the recent talks, a special emphasis was
placed on Taiwan's cooperation on the international stage,
including in places such as the Asia-Pacific Economic
Cooperation forum and the World Trade Organization; and

Whereas, Taiwan has undertaken a policy of "steadfast diplomacy" in its international relations and is capable of, and willing to, fulfill its responsibilities and collaborate with the world to deal with the challenges of humanitarian aid and disease control: Therefore,

# Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. That the Indiana Senate reaffirms its commitment to the strengthening and deepening of the sister ties between the State of Indiana and Taiwan.

SECTION 2. That the Indiana Senate reaffirms its support for the Taiwan Relations Act and urges all enterprises in Indiana to refer to Taiwan as Taiwan.

SECTION 3. That the Indiana Senate encourages the pursuit of a Bilateral Trade Agreement through the TIFA, supports an agreement for the avoidance of double taxation, supports the inclusion of Taiwan in the Indo-Pacific Economic Framework for Prosperity, and reiterates its support for a closer economic and trade partnership between the State of Indiana and Taiwan.

SECTION 4. That the Indiana Senate continues to support Taiwan's meaningful participation in international organizations which impact the health, safety, and well-being of the people of Taiwan, and supports Taiwan's aspiration to make more contributions in international societies.

SECTION 5. That the Indiana Senate continues to support the strengthening of education linkages with Taiwan.

SECTION 6. The Secretary of the Senate is hereby directed to transmit copies of this Resolution to the members of the
