MADAM PRESIDENT:

I offer the following resolution and move its adoption:

1	A SENATE RESOLUTION urging the Indiana General
2	Assembly to study the impact that pregnant women have on the
3	Healthy Indiana Plan (HIP).

5	Whereas, Indiana's recent Medicaid waiver submission
6	included transferring services for pregnant women from
7	Hoosier Healthwise to the Healthy Indiana Plan's (HIP)
8	Maternity Care program;
9	Whereas, It is unclear whether the same level of care
10	regarding maternal mental health and addiction services will
11	be offered to expecting and new mothers under the HIP
12	program that they did under Hoosier Healthwise;
13	Whereas, According to the World Health Organization,
14	worldwide, approximately 10 percent of pregnant women and
15	13 percent of women who have just given birth experience a
16	mental disorder, primarily depression;
17	Whereas, Considering that Indiana ranks 44th in the nation
18	in relation to maternal mortality, the issue of maternal care for
19	mental health and drug addiction is of the utmost concern; and

1	Whereas, The state of Indiana has a vested interest in			
2	ensuring that the same level of care is provided under the HIP			
3	maternity care program as was offered under Hoosier			
4	Healthwise: Therefore,			
5	Be it resolved by the Senate of the

7	SECTION 1. That the legislative council is urged to assign to the			
8	appropriate study committee the impact that pregnant women have on			
9	the Healthy Indiana Plan (HIP).
