SENATE RESOLUTION

MADAM PRESIDENT:

I offer the following resolution and move its adoption:

1 A SENATE RESOLUTION honoring and recognizing 2 victims of Agent Orange during the Vietnam War.

3 Whereas, Agent Orange is one of a class of color-coded 4 herbicides that United States forces sprayed over the rural 5 landscape of Vietnam to defoliate trees and shrubs and destroy 6 crops;

7 Whereas, The United States Air Force began the aerial
8 spraying program Operation Hades, later known as Operation
9 Ranch Hand, in January of 1962 and continued until February
10 1971;

11 Whereas, The United States sprayed Agent Orange at a 12 concentration 20 times higher than recommended by the 13 manufacturers;

Whereas, The Red Cross estimates millions of Americans
and Vietnamese are presently affected by the wartime spraying
of Agent Orange and other herbicides;

Whereas, Agent Orange is a dioxin and cancer-causing
chemical that enters the body through physical contact or
ingestion, then moves into the human cell nucleus, where it

attacks the genes and causes a number of serious illnesses and
 birth defects;

Whereas, In the 1970s, high levels of dioxin were found in
the breast milk of South Vietnamese women and in the blood of
United States military personnel who served in Vietnam;

6 Whereas, Agent Orange is linked to numerous types of 7 cancer, including chronic B-cell leukemia, Hodgkin's 8 lymphoma, non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, multiple myeloma, 9 prostate cancer, respiratory cancer, lung cancer, and soft tissue 10 sarcomas;

Whereas, Agent Orange is linked to other health conditions,
including AL amyloidosis, chloracne, diabetes mellitus type 2,
hypothyroidism, ischemic heart disease, Parkinsonism,
Parkinson's disease, early-onset peripheral neuropathy, and
porphyria cutanea tarda;

Whereas, Agent Orange is linked to birth defects in the
children of Vietnamese civilians and American veterans, which
include mental disabilities, hernias, extra digits, spina bifida,
neural tube defects, and other physical deformations;

Whereas, While fallen soldiers are memorialized on The
Wall at the Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Washington, D.C.,
those veterans who were victims of Agent Orange are not
recognized as fatalities of the Vietnam War; and

Whereas, It is most appropriate that the Indiana State Senate should honor these veterans to the full extent of its ability, as these veterans have made untold and innumerable sacrifices to preserve the liberties the state of Indiana enjoys today and will continue to cherish for generations to come: Therefore,
