MADAM PRESIDENT:

I offer the following resolution and move its adoption:

1	A SENATE RESOLUTION recognizing the importance of
2	the Bible in history.
3	Whereas, Johann Gutenberg, the man who changed the
4	world with the invention of the printing press, chose the Bible
5	as the first book to be printed;
6	Whereas, The Bible is a perennial best-seller, with over five
7	billion copies distributed during the past millennium;
8	Whereas, The Bible has been translated, in whole or in
9	part, into 3,312 different languages;
10	Whereas, Surveys report that nine out of ten Americans
11	have Bibles in their homes;
12	Whereas, Many of the great works of literature, art, and
13	music in the past millennium were inspired by the Bible;
14	Whereas, The earliest public education law in America
15	(1642) was based on the importance of each student knowing
16	the Bible in order to avoid the civil atrocities that had beset
17	Europe;

1	Whereas, The first literacy laws in America were enacted
2	to protect citizens from tyrannical government through a
3	knowledge of the Bible;
4	Whereas, Our earliest constitutions, compacts, charters,
5	and laws and various drafts of the original state constitutions
6	reflect the central role of the Bible in shaping America's civil
7	institutions;
8	Whereas, John Locke's Treatises cited the Scriptures over
9	1,700 times in explaining the proper foundations for civil
10	government and was a primary source for drafting the
11	Declaration of Independence;
12	Whereas, During the Founding Era (1760-1805), the Bible
13	was heavily relied upon in the formation of our founding
14	documents;
15	Whereas, Traditionally, United States presidents have taken
16	the oath of office on the Bible;
17	Whereas, The Bible has formed the basis of civil justice,
18	being the book on which witnesses are sworn in courts of law;
19	and
20	Whereas, The teachings in the Bible were the impetus
21	behind the abolition of slavery, the birth of the Civil Rights
22	movement, and inspired humanitarian movements that have
23	elevated the lives of every American: Therefore,
24	Be it resolved by the Senate of the
25	General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

27	SECTION 1. That the Indiana Senate recognizes the Bible's
28	influential role in our country's history and humanitarian
29	progress throughout the world.
