### MADAM PRESIDENT:

I offer the following resolution and move its adoption:

1	A SENATE RESOLUTION urging the Legislative Council
2	to assign the topics of court costs for indigent individuals and
3	the look-back time period for prior unrelated convictions in
4	Indiana's criminal code to the appropriate study committee.
5	Whereas, The term "indigent individual" commonly refers
6	to a person who is too poor to hire a lawyer and who, upon
7	indictment, becomes eligible to receive aid from a court-
8	appointed attorney and a waiver of court costs;
9	Whereas, Current Indiana Criminal Code does not define
10	the term "indigent";
11	Whereas, It is unclear how Indiana courts are determining
12	indigence when considering court costs;
13	Whereas, During sentencing for some offenses, judges have
14	the discretion to consider and individual's prior convictions in
15	determining the appropriate sentence; and
16	Whereas, Current Indiana Code does not provide standard
17	guidelines regarding consideration of prior unrelated
18	convictions during sentencing: Therefore,
