SENATE RESOLUTION No. 56

MADAM PRESIDENT:

I offer the following resolution and move its adoption:

1 2 3	A SENATE RESOLUTION urging the legislative council to assign to the appropriate study committee the topic of school district financial condition analysis and monitoring.
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4	Whereas, There are many difficult fiscal issues facing
5	school districts today, including low general purpose
6	reserves, internal borrowing from self-insurance funds, and
7	declining state revenues due to lower enrollment; and
8	Whereas, The financial condition of local school districts
9	has not improved significantly, and may have even worsened,
10	in recent years: Therefore,
11	Be it resolved by the Senate
12	of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:
13	SECTION 1. That the legislative council is urged to assign to the
14	appropriate committee the topic of school district financial condition
15	analysis and monitoring.
16	SECTION 2. That if the topic is assigned to the appropriate study
17	committee, the study committee shall do the following:
18	(1) Study the effectiveness of establishing a program in the
19	appropriate state agency to do the following:
20	(a) Annually analyze and monitor financial condition measures
21	for school districts.
22	(b) Benchmark and analyze trends in these measures.
23	(c) Assist school districts experiencing fiscal stress with
24	corrective action.
25	(2) Examine and test generally accepted financial condition
26	measures on a select group of Indiana school districts.
27	(3) Examine the extent that the financial condition measures of



1	each such school district are influenced by the following:
2	(a) Features of the school funding formula.
3	(b) Low or declining assessed values.
4	(c) Low property tax collection rates.
5	(d) Physical plant conditions.
6	(e) The presence of charter schools.
7	(f) Property tax caps.
8	(g) The presence of Pool 5 personal property.
9	(h) The use of choice scholarships by students residing in the
10	district.
11	(i) Transportation issues.
