5 Whereas, John Pittman was born on February 4, 1933, in
6 Princeton, Indiana, to his parents the late Leonard Elmore and
7 L. Audrey Dorsett Pittman;

8 Whereas, John graduated from the Indiana University
9 School of Medicine in 1957, serving as Class President;

Whereas, As a Captain in the United States Army Medical
Corps, John was stationed at Tripler General Hospital in
Honolulu, Hawaii, from 1957 to 1958;

Whereas, John trained in General Surgery Residency at
Methodist Hospital from 1960 to 1963, followed by his Thoracic
and Cardiovascular Surgery Residency at the University of
Michigan from 1963 to 1965;

Whereas, John was a Co-Founder and Cardiovascular 1 Surgeon of Cardiovascular Surgical Services founded in 1965 2 at Methodist Hospital in Indianapolis; 3 4 Whereas, John met the love of his life, Euna Rose Williams, during his residency at Methodist Hospital and they were 5 married in 1957; 6 7 Whereas, Married for 53 years until Euna passed away in 8 2010, John loved, honored, and cared for her until the end; 9 Whereas, John is survived by their five children: John Scott Pittman, Mark Anthony Pitman, Steve Alan Pittman, Anne 10 Marie Kelton, and Chad Andrew Pitman; their 20 11 grandchildren; 4 great grandchildren; and John's brother 12 James Lenard Pitman: 13 Whereas, Together, Dr. Harry Siderys and John pioneered 14 15 the development of new cardiovascular surgical techniques in the State of Indiana; 16 Whereas, John dedicated his career to the highest quality 17 of patient care, resident education, and innovation in the 18 rapidly developing field of Cardiovascular Surgery; 19 Whereas, John was a member of the team that performed 20 the first open heart procedure in 1965 at Methodist Hospital, 21 which rapidly evolved into one of the busiest programs in the 22 country by 1971; 23 Whereas, After developing a new sternal retractor system 24 for use in coronary artery bypass graft surgery and later 25 becoming part of the first group in the state to perform heart 26 transplantation in 1982, John retired in 1999; 27 Whereas, John received several awards for his 28 distinguished career including the J.O. Ritchey Society and 29
