SENATE RESOLUTION

MADAM PRESIDENT:

I offer the following resolution and move its adoption:

1 A SENATE RESOLUTION honoring the Indiana 2 Geological and Water Survey on the 185th anniversary of 3 state-supported geological study in Indiana.

Whereas, On February 6, 1837, the Indiana General
Assembly authorized the Governor "to appoint and commission
a person of talents, integrity, and suitable scientific
acquirements as Geologist for the State of Indiana";

8 Whereas, Governor Noah Noble chose David Dale Owen 9 of New Harmony to be the first State Geologist, and Owen 10 would go on to travel hundreds of miles on horseback 11 examining the state's geology, including its stone and coal 12 resources;

Whereas, Owen submitted two reports of his field work to the General Assembly, which provided the basis for the work of the Indiana state geologists who succeeded him by correctly identifying the stratigraphic succession of Indiana bedrock and revealing a scientific method for finding stone, clay, and other underground resources for the Indiana economy;

19 Whereas, In 1859, the General Assembly authorized a

geological survey under the authority of the State Board of
 Agriculture and a second geological study was completed in
 1862;

Whereas, Over the ensuing decades state-supported geological studies took various forms until it arrived at the current Indiana Geological and Water Survey ("the IGWS"), which is directed by the state geologist and operated under the auspices of the Board of Trustees of Indiana University;

9 Whereas, It is the mission of the IGWS to research, survey, 10 collect, and preserve geologic specimens and data, and 11 disseminate information to contribute to the mitigation of 12 geologic hazards and the wise stewardship of the energy, 13 mineral, and water resources of Indiana;

Whereas, Throughout its storied history, the scientists of
the IGWS have created and refined state geologic data and
have grown the collection of Indiana geologic specimens to
more than 2 million items valued at \$2 billion; and

18 Whereas, On the occasion of its 185th anniversary, it is 19 fitting that the Indiana Senate recognizes the IGWS for its 20 contribution to the advancement of science and the 21 preservation and development of Indiana's natural resources: 22 Therefore,

Be it resolved by the Senate of the
General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. That the Indiana Senate honors the Indiana
 Geological and Water Survey on the 185th anniversary of
 state-supported geological study in Indiana.

29 to transmit a copy of this Resolution to IGWS Director and
30 State Geologist, Todd Thompson.
