1 А SENATE RESOLUTION recognizing and acknowledging the significant contributions that American 2 Sikhs have made across the United States and to the State of 3 Indiana on the occasion of Vaisakhi as "National Sikh Day". 4 5 Whereas, Sikhism is a monotheistic religion that was founded 500 years ago and believes in one omnipresent God; 6 Whereas, Guru Nanak was the founder and first guru of 7 8 Sikhs: 9 Whereas, Vaisakhi is an annual event celebrated in the month of April in the punjab region of India, and American 10 Sikhs celebrate Vaisakhi as "National Sikh Day"; 11 Whereas, Sikhism today has a following of over 20 million 12 people worldwide and is currently the fifth largest religion; 13 Whereas, Among other things, Sikhism preaches a message 14 of devotion, truthful living, equality of mankind, and social 15 justice; 16 17 Whereas, Key tenants of Sikhism include living the life of a

1 2	householder, earning an honest living, and avoiding worldly temptations and sins;
3	<i>Whereas, Sikhs believe that people of different races,</i>
3 4	religions, or sex are all equal in the eyes of God and in the full
5	equality of men and women;
6	Whereas, There are nearly one million Sikhs living in the
7	United States, and an estimated 10,000 Sikhs living in Indiana;
8	Whereas, The Sikh people have been living in the United
9	States for over 100 years, and in Indiana for over 50 years;
10	Whereas, The Sikh place of worship is known as Gurdwara
11	Sahib, and there are currently more than 20 Gurdwara Sahibs
12	all over Indiana;
13	Whereas, A hallmark of Sikh values and tradition is the
14	community kitchen, known as Langar. Langar is the term used
15	in the Sikh religion for the common kitchen where food is
16	served in all Gurdwaras to all the visitors, without distinction
17	of faith, religion, or background, for free;
18	Whereas, Sikhs are one of the fastest growing business
19	communities in Indiana;
20	Whereas, Indiana is home to about 3,500 Sikh-owned
21	businesses, including gas stations, convenience stores,
22	restaurants, and trucking and transportation businesses;
23	Whereas, Sikhs in the United States pursue diverse
24	professions and walks of life, making rich contributions to the
25	economic vibrancy of the United States as farmers, engineers,
26	doctors, scientists, and business owners;
27	Whereas, Sikhs continue to make strides toward securing
28	religious liberty as patriotic members of the United States
29	Armed Forces;

4	continue to serve our country, our state, and our communities;
5	Whereas, The faithful service of the Sikh community to this
6	state and the country merits appreciation as an integral thread
7	in the fabric of American plurality; and
8	Whereas, It is fitting that the Indiana Senate recognizes and
9	acknowledges the significant contributions that American Sikhs
10	have made across the United States, to the State of Indiana, and
11	to local communities on the great occasion of Vaisakhi as
12	"National Sikh Day": Therefore,
13	Be it resolved by the Senate of the
14	General Assembly of the State of Indiana:
15	SECTION 1. That the Indiana Senate recognizes and
16	acknowledges the significant contributions that American
17	Sikhs have made across the United States and to the State of
18	Indiana on the great occasion of Vaisakhi as "National Sikh
19	Day".
