SENATE RESOLUTION

MADAM PRESIDENT:

I offer the following resolution and move its adoption:

1	A SENATE RESOLUTION urging the Legislative Council
2	to assign to an appropriate study committee the topic of
3	education and prevention of sexually transmitted diseases.
4	Whereas, Family planning is essential to securing the well-
5	being and autonomy of women, while supporting the health and
6	development of communities;
7	Whereas, The study committee will research how to
8	improve access to rural health, genital human papillomavirus
9	(HPV) education and vaccination, and sexually transmitted
10	disease (STD) prevention;
11	Whereas, HPV is the most common STD. There are more
12	than 40 HPV types that can infect males and females. Most
13	people who become infected with HPV do not realize they are
14	infected or that they are passing the virus because there are no
15	symptoms;
16	Whereas, There is no treatment for the HPV virus itself, but
17	vaccines can protect males and females against some of the
18	most common types of HPV;

1	Whereas, STDs, particularly Chlamydia and gonorrhea
2	infections, are significant public health problems. More than
3	22,000 cases of Chlamydia and 6,400 cases of gonorrhea were
4	reported in Indiana in 2010, making them the two most
5	commonly reported communicable infections;
6	Whereas, Partners infected with Chlamydia and gonorrhea
7	are often asymptomatic, and therefore, are unlikely to seek
8	medical treatment;
9	Whereas, Even when doctors and other health practioners
0	counsel patients about the need for partner treatment, some
1	partners have limited or no access to medical care or choose
2	not to seek care; and
3	Whereas, Improving access to family planning would help
4	prevent the transmission of STDs, prevent pregnancy-related
5	health risks in women, reduce infant mortality, and empower
6	people and enhance education: Therefore,
7	Be it resolved by the Senate of the
8	General Assembly of the State of Indiana:
9	SECTION 1. That the Legislative Council is urged to assign to an

1	sexually transmitted diseases
