AN ACT concerning property taxation; relating to county appraisers; appointing interim appraiser; amending K.S.A.<u>2012</u> 2013 Supp. 19-430 and repealing the existing section.

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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 2012 2013 Supp. 19-430 is hereby amended to read 6 7 as follows: 19-430. (a) On July 1, 1993, and on July 1 of each fourth year 8 thereafter, the board of county commissioners or governing body of any 9 unified government of each county shall by resolution appoint a county 10 appraiser for such county who shall serve for a term of four years-and until 11 a successor is appointed expiring on June 30 of the fourth year 12 thereafter. No person shall be appointed or reappointed to or serve as 13 county appraiser in any county under the provisions of this act unless such person shall have at least three years of mass appraisal experience and be 14 qualified by the director of property valuation as an eligible Kansas 15 16 appraiser under the provisions of this act. Whenever a vacancy shall occur in the office of county appraiser the board of county commissioners or 17 18 governing body of any unified government shall appoint an eligible 19 Kansas appraiser to fill such vacancy for the unexpired term-and until a 20 successor is appointed. The person holding the office of county or district 21 appraiser or performing the duties thereof on the effective date of this act 22 shall continue to hold such office and perform such duties until a county 23 appraiser is appointed under the provisions of this act. No person shall be 24 appointed to the office of county or district appraiser or to fill a vacancy 25 therein unless such person is currently: (1) A certified general real property 26 appraiser pursuant to article 41 of chapter 58 of the Kansas Statutes 27 Annotated, and amendments thereto; (2) a registered mass appraiser 28 pursuant to rules and regulations adopted by the secretary of revenue; or 29 (3) holding a valid residential evaluation specialist or certified assessment 30 evaluation designation from the International Association of Assessing 31 Officers. Notwithstanding the foregoing provision, any person who holds 32 the office of county or district appraiser on the effective date of this act-33 and who is not eligible for reappointment pursuant to this section shall be 34 eligible for reappointment to such office or appointment as a county or district appraiser in another county for a term expiring on July 1, 1999, and 35 if any such person qualifies for an original appointment or reappointment 36

1 prior to July 1, 1999, such person may be reappointed for a full term, and

2 any other person who has at least three years of mass appraisal experience

3 and is qualified by the director of property valuation as an eligible Kansas

4 appraiser shall be eligible for appointment to such office for a term-

5 expiring on July 1, 1999, and if any such person qualifies for an original 6 appointment prior to July 1, 1999, such person may be reappointed for a

full termthe board of county commissioners or governing body of any

8 unified government may appoint an interim county appraiser, subject to

9 the approval of the director of property valuation, for a period not to 10 exceed six months to fill a vacancy in the office of county appraiser 11 pending the appointment of an eligible county appraiser under the 12 provisions of this act.

(b) The secretary of revenue shall adopt rules and regulations prior to
October 1, 1997, necessary to establish qualifications for the designation
of a registered mass appraiser.
