1 AN ACT making and concerning appropriations for fiscal years ending
2 June 30, 2014, June 30, 2015, June 30, 2016, June 30, 2017, and June
3 30, 2018, for state agencies; authorizing certain transfers, capital
4 improvement projects and fees, imposing certain restrictions and
5 limitations, and directing or authorizing certain receipts, disbursements,
6 procedures and acts incidental to the foregoing; amending K.S.A. 2013
7 Supp. 12-5256, 79-34,156, 79-4227 and 79-4804 and repealing the
8 existing sections.

10 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

11 Section 1. (a) For the fiscal years ending June 30, 2014, June 30,
12 2015, June 30, 2016, June 30, 2017, and June 30, 2018, appropriations are
13 hereby made, restrictions and limitations are hereby imposed, and
14 transfers, capital improvement projects, fees, receipts, disbursements and
15 acts incidental to the foregoing are hereby directed or authorized as
16 provided in this act.

17 (b) The agencies named in this act are hereby authorized to initiate
18 and complete the capital improvement projects specified and authorized by
19 this act or for which appropriations are made by this act, subject to the
20 restrictions and limitations imposed by this act.

21 (c) This act shall not be subject to the provisions of subsection (a) of
22 K.S.A. 75-6702, and amendments thereto.

23 (d) The appropriations made by this act shall not be subject to the
24 provisions of K.S.A. 46-155, and amendments thereto.

12 congressional districts of the state. Except as provided by subsection (g),
13 all moneys credited to the state economic development initiatives fund
14 shall be credited within the fund, as provided by law, to an account or
15 accounts of the fund which are created by this section.

16 (b) There is hereby created the Kansas capital formation account in
17 the state economic development initiatives fund. All moneys credited to
18 the Kansas capital formation account shall be used to provide, encourage
19 and implement capital development and formation in Kansas.

20 (c) There is hereby created the Kansas economic development
21 research and development account in the state economic development
22 initiatives fund. All moneys credited to the Kansas economic development
23 research and development account shall be used to promote, encourage
24 and implement research and development programs and activities in
25 Kansas and technical assistance funded through state educational
26 institutions under the supervision and control of the state board of regents
27 or other Kansas colleges and universities.

28 (d) There is hereby created the Kansas economic development
29 endowment account in the state economic development initiatives fund.
30 All moneys credited to the Kansas economic development endowment
31 account shall be accumulated and invested as provided in this section to
32 provide an ongoing source of funds which shall be used for economic
33 development activities in Kansas, including, but not limited to, continuing
34 appropriations or demand transfers for programs and projects which shall
35 include, but are not limited to, specific community infrastructure projects
36 in Kansas that stimulate economic growth.

37 (e) Except as provided in subsection (f), the director of investments
38 may invest and reinvest moneys credited to the state economic
39 development initiatives fund in accordance with investment policies
40 established by the pooled money investment board under K.S.A. 75-4232,
41 and amendments thereto, in the pooled money investment portfolio. All
42 moneys received as interest earned by the investment of the moneys
43 credited to the state economic development initiatives fund shall be

1 deposited in the state treasury and credited to the Kansas economic
2 development endowment account of such fund.

3 (f) Moneys credited to the Kansas economic development
4 endowment account of the state economic development initiatives fund
5 may be invested in government guaranteed loans and debentures as
6 provided by law in addition to the investments authorized by subsection
7 (e) or in lieu of such investments. All moneys received as interest earned
8 by the investment under this subsection of the moneys credited to the
9 Kansas economic development endowment account shall be deposited in
10 the state treasury and credited to the Kansas economic development
11 endowment account of the state economic development initiatives fund.

12 (g) *Except as provided further*, in each fiscal year, the director of
13 accounts and reports shall make transfers in equal amounts on July 15 and
14 January 15 which in the aggregate equal \$2,000,000 from the state
15 economic development initiatives fund to the state water plan fund created
16 by K.S.A. 82a-951, and amendments thereto, ~~except that~~. No moneys shall
17 be transferred from the state economic development initiatives fund to the
18 state water plan fund on such dates during state fiscal year 2014 ~~or state~~
19 ~~fiscal year 2015~~. *In state fiscal year 2015, the director of accounts and*
20 *reports shall make transfers in equal amounts on July 15 and January 15*
21 *which in the aggregate equal \$800,000 from the state economic*
22 *development initiatives fund to the state water plan fund*. No other moneys
23 credited to the state economic development initiatives fund shall be used
24 for: (1) Water-related projects or programs, or related technical assistance;
25 or (2) any other projects or programs, or related technical assistance,
26 which meet one or more of the long-range goals, objectives and
27 considerations set forth in the state water resource planning act.

30 Sec. 111. *Severability*. If any provision or clause of this act or
31 application thereof to any person or circumstances is held invalid, such

35 Sec. 112. *Appeals to exceed expenditure limitations*. (a) Upon written
36 application to the governor and approval of the state finance council,
37 expenditures from special revenue funds may exceed the amounts
38 specified in this act.

39 (b) This section shall not apply to the expanded lottery act revenues
40 fund, the state economic development initiatives fund, the children's
41 initiative fund, the state water plan fund or the Kansas endowment for
42 youth fund, or to any account of any such funds.

43 Sec. 113. *Savings*. (a) Any unencumbered balance as of June 30,

1 2014, in any special revenue fund, or account thereof, of any state agency
2 named in chapter 136 of the 2013 Session Laws of Kansas or this act
3 which is not otherwise specifically appropriated or limited for fiscal year
4 2015 by chapter 136 of the 2013 Session Laws of Kansas, this act or any
5 other appropriation act of the 2014 regular session of the legislature, is
6 hereby appropriated for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015, for the same
7 use and purpose as the same was heretofore appropriated.

8 (b) This section shall not apply to the expanded lottery act revenues
9 fund, the state economic development initiatives fund, the children's
10 initiatives fund, the state water plan fund, the Kansas endowment for youth
11 fund, the Kansas educational building fund, the state institutions building
12 fund, or the correctional institutions building fund, or to any account of
13 any of such funds.

14 Sec. 114. (a) During the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015, all moneys
15 which are lawfully credited to and available in any bond special revenue
16 fund, which are not otherwise specifically appropriated or limited by
17 chapter 136 of the 2013 Session Laws of Kansas, this act or other
18 appropriation act of the 2014 regular session of the legislature, are hereby
19 appropriated for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015, for the state agency
20 for which the bond special revenue fund was established for the purposes
21 authorized by law for expenditures from such bond special revenue fund.

22 (b) As used in this section, "bond special revenue fund" means any
23 special revenue fund or account thereof established in the state treasury
24 prior to or on or after the effective date of this act for the deposit of the
25 proceeds of bonds issued by the Kansas development finance authority, for
26 the payment of debt service for bonds issued by the Kansas development
27 finance authority, or for any related purpose in accordance with applicable
28 bond covenants.

29 Sec. 115. *Federal grants.* (a) During the fiscal year ending June 30,
30 2015, each federal grant or other federal receipt which is received by a
31 state agency named in chapter 136 of the 2013 Session Laws of Kansas or
32 this act and which is not otherwise appropriated to that state agency for
33 fiscal year 2015 by chapter 136 of the 2013 Session Laws of Kansas, this
34 act or other appropriation act of the 2014 regular session of the legislature,
35 is hereby appropriated for fiscal year 2015 for that state agency for the
36 purpose set forth in such federal grant or receipt, except that no
37 expenditure shall be made from and no obligation shall be incurred against
38 any such federal grant or other federal receipt, which has not been
39 previously appropriated or reappropriated or approved for expenditure by
40 the governor, for fiscal year 2015, until the governor has authorized the
41 state agency to make expenditures from such federal grant or other federal
42 receipt for fiscal year 2015.

43 (b) In addition to the other purposes for which expenditures may be

1 made by any state agency which is named in chapter 136 of the 2013
2 Session Laws of Kansas or this act and which is not otherwise authorized
3 by law to apply for and receive federal grants, expenditures may be made
4 by such state agency from moneys appropriated for fiscal year 2015 by
5 chapter 136 of the 2013 Session Laws of Kansas, this act or any other
6 appropriation act of the 2014 regular session of the legislature to apply for
7 and receive federal grants during fiscal year 2015, which federal grants are

18 balance as of June 30, 2014, in excess of \$100 is hereby reappropriated for
19 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015, for the same uses and purposes as
20 originally appropriated unless specific provision is made for lapsing such
21 appropriation.

22 (b) This subsection shall not apply to the unencumbered balance in
23 any account of the correctional institutions building fund that was
24 encumbered for any fiscal year commencing prior to July 1, 2013.

25 Sec. 117. (a) Any Kansas educational building fund appropriation
26 heretofore appropriated to any institution named in chapter 136 of the
27 2013 Session Laws of Kansas, this act or other appropriation act of the
28 2014 regular session of the legislature and having an unencumbered
29 balance as of June 30, 2014, in excess of \$100 is hereby reappropriated for
30 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015, for the same use and purpose as
31 originally appropriated, unless specific provision is made for lapsing such
32 appropriation.

33 (b) This subsection shall not apply to the unencumbered balance in
34 any account of the Kansas educational building fund that was encumbered
35 for any fiscal year commencing prior to July 1, 2013.

36 Sec. 118. (a) Any state institutions building fund appropriation
37 heretofore appropriated to any state agency named in chapter 136 of the
38 2013 Session Laws of Kansas, this act or other appropriation act of the
39 2014 regular session of the legislature and having an unencumbered
40 balance as of June 30, 2014, in excess of \$100 is hereby reappropriated for
41 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015, for the same use and purpose as
42 originally appropriated, unless specific provision is made for lapsing such
43 appropriation.

1 (b) This subsection shall not apply to the unencumbered balance in
2 any account of the state institutions building fund that was encumbered for
3 any fiscal year commencing prior to July 1, 2013.

4 Sec. 119. (a) Any transfers of money during the fiscal year ending
5 June 30, 2015, from any special revenue fund of any state agency named
6 in chapter 136 of the 2013 Session Laws of Kansas or this act to the audit
7 services fund of the division of post audit under K.S.A. 46-1121, and
8 amendments thereto, shall be in addition to any expenditure limitation
9 imposed on any such fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015.
