1 AN ACT concerning drivers' licenses; relating to revocation; duration;
2 amending K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 8-254 and repealing the existing section.

4 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

5 Section 1. K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 8-254 is hereby amended to read as
6 follows: 8-254. (a) Subject to the provisions of subsection (b), the division
7 shall revoke a person's driving privileges *for a period of 90 days* upon
8 receiving a record of the person's conviction of any of the following
9 offenses, including municipal violations, when the conviction has become
10 final, or upon receiving a record of a person's adjudication as a juvenile
11 offender for commission of an act which, if committed by a person 18 or
12 more years of age, would constitute any of the following offenses when
13 the adjudication has become final:

14 (1) Involuntary manslaughter, as defined in ~~subsection (a)(2) of~~
15 K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 21-5405(a)(2), and amendments thereto, if the crime is
16 committed while committing a violation of K.S.A. 8-1566 or ~~subsection~~
17 ~~(a) of~~ 8-1568(a), and amendments thereto, or the ordinance of a city or
18 resolution of a county which prohibits any acts prohibited by those
19 statutes;

20 (2) vehicular homicide, as defined in K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 21-5406,
21 and amendments thereto;

22 (3) battery, as defined in ~~subsection (a)(1) of~~ K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 21-
23 5413(a)(1), and amendments thereto, if the crime is committed while
24 committing a violation of K.S.A. 8-1566 or 8-1568, and amendments
25 thereto, or the ordinance of a city or resolution of a county which prohibits
26 the acts prohibited by those statutes;

27 (4) failure to stop and render aid as required under the laws of this
28 state in the event of a motor vehicle accident resulting in the death or
29 personal injury of another;

30 (5) conviction, or forfeiture of bail not vacated, upon a charge of
31 reckless driving;

32 (6) conviction, or forfeiture of bail not vacated of any felony in the
33 commission of which a motor vehicle is used; or

34 (7) fleeing or attempting to elude a police officer as provided in
35 K.S.A. 8-1568, and amendments thereto, or conviction of violation of an
36 ordinance of any city or a law of another state which is in substantial

1 conformity with such statute.

2 (b) In lieu of revoking a person's driving privileges as provided by
3 subsection (a), the court in which the person is convicted or adjudicated
4 may place restrictions on the person's driving privileges as provided by
5 K.S.A. 8-292, and amendments thereto, unless the violation was
6 committed while operating a commercial motor vehicle, as defined in
7 K.S.A. 8-2,128, *and amendments thereto*. Driving privileges are to be
8 automatically revoked if the violation which leads to the subsequent
9 conviction occurs in a commercial motor vehicle, as defined in K.S.A. 8-
10 2,128, *and amendments thereto*.

11 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 8-254 is hereby repealed.

12 Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its
13 publication in the statute book.
