This sum shall be paid whether the 8 General Assembly is in regular or extraordinary session and shall be in full 9 recompense of any additional expenses incurred in excess of that now received by 10 them. 11 For any extraordinary session called under Section 80 of the Constitution of 12 Kentucky, or any session convened upon Joint Proclamation of the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives, no additional 13 14 expense allowance authorized under this section shall be paid to any member 15 during those days declared as veto days by the General Assembly.
