**PURPOSE OF MEASURE:** This measure requires coverage for genetic testing for cancer risks as dictated by the National Comprehensive Cancer Network (NCCN). Authority is given to the commissioner of the Department of Insurance to extend the coverage for the genetic testing to include recommendations that are consistent with the most recent version of the guidelines published by NCCN. Furthermore, this coverage shall not be subject to deductibles, coinsurance or any other cost-sharing requirements.

**FISCAL EXPLANATION:** SB 30 has no fiscal impact. The Department of Insurance indicates the requirement of SB 30 would be included within the federal mandate to cover preventive services and Kentucky would not be required to pay a premium increase for Affordable Care Act plans.
