4		→ S	ection 1. KRS 160.599 is amended to read as follows:
5	(1)	A sp	pecial fund is hereby created which shall be known as "the emergency revolving
6		scho	ol loan fund account," hereinafter referred to as account. This account, which
7		shall	be administered by the Kentucky Board of Education, is for the purpose of
8		prov	riding emergency loans to eligible public common school districts.
9	(2)	[In c	order to be eligible for a loan from the account, a school district shall meet all of
10		the f	Collowing conditions:
11	(a)	A lo	ss of physical facilities must have been suffered as a result of a fire or a natural
12		disa	ster;
13	(b)	Insu	rance on such facilities was insufficient to replace the loss;
14	(c)	The	district is bonded to practical capacity and has insufficient resources to meet its
15		imm	rediate capital outlay needs as determined by an investigation of the chief state
16		sche	ol officer.
17	(3)	As a	an alternative to the criteria in subsection (2) of this section,]A school district
18		shall	be eligible for a loan from the account if:
19		<u>(a)</u>	The sheriff has failed to collect or disburse delinquent tax revenue, which is
20			for the benefit of the school district, within the fiscal year that the school
21			district is to utilize those receipts according to its budget:[.]
22		<u>(b)</u>	The school district has a significant revenue shortfall within the immediate
23			prior year, the current year, or the upcoming fiscal year, due to
24			circumstances beyond the district's control which the district has made
25			reasonable and prudent efforts to mitigate; or
26		<u>(c)</u>	There are any other extraordinary financial circumstances which warrant
27			an emergency loan, as determined by the Kentucky Board of Education on

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1		recommendation of the chief state school officer.			
2	<u>(3)</u> [(4)]	[Under the criteria of subsection (2) of this section,]No loan from the account			
3	shall	be made for a period in excess of five (5)[ten (10)] years[, and under the			
4	crite	ria of subsection (3) of this section, no loan from the account shall be made for			
5	a pe	riod in excess of three (3) years]. The maximum amount of any one (1) loar			
6	from the account shall not exceed five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000)[two				
7	hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000)] and shall be determined by the Kentucky				
8	Board of Education on recommendation of the chief state school officer.				
9	<u>(4)</u> [(5)]	The Kentucky Board of Education shall establish the terms and conditions for			
10	repa	ying the principal of such loan and interest shall not be charged on the loan			
11	<u>The</u>	Kentucky Board of Education may promulgate administrative regulations in			
12	acco	rdance with KRS Chapter 13A as needed for the loan process.[No loan shall			
13	cove	er a loss prior to January 1, 1972.]			
14	<u>(5)</u> [(6)]	The Kentucky Department of Education shall monitor any loans made and			
15	<u>prov</u>	ide by October 1 of each year an annual written report to the Interim Join			
16	<u>Com</u>	mittee on Appropriations and Revenue on the status of the loan fund			
17	account as of the immediately previous September 1. [School districts eligible				
18	under this section to borrow from the account shall file formal application for such				
19	loan	on forms provided by the state department of education. Before any loan is			
20	mad	e, the application must be approved by the Kentucky Board of Education on the			
21	reco	mmendation of the chief state school officer.]			
22	<u>(6)</u> [(7)]	All repayments of loans made under this section shall be paid into the			
23	eme	rgency revolving school loan fund account, which shall be funded by ar			
24	appr	opriation through the biennial budget. Balances remaining in the fund shall no			
25	reve	rt to the general fund at the end of any fiscal year.			
26	<u>(7)</u> [(8)]	On approval of the loan application by the Kentucky Board of Education or			
27	the	recommendation of the chief state school officer, the Finance and			

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1	Administration Cabinet, on the certification of the chief state school officer, shall
2	draw a warrant on the State Treasurer for the amount of the approved loan that is
3	due the school district. The check shall be issued by the State Treasurer and
4	transmitted to the Department of Education for distribution to the proper official of
5	the school district when the district has complied with the rules and regulations of
6	the Kentucky Board of Education.
7	(8)[(9)] Any loan to a local school district under the provisions of this section shall not
8	be considered as an indebtedness of the school district within the meaning of
9	Sections 157 and 158 of the Kentucky Constitution.
10	→ Section 2. 2016 Kentucky Acts Chapter 149, Part I, Operating Budget, C.
11	Department of Education, 1. Support Education Excellence in Kentucky (SEEK). (3)
12	Base SEEK Allotments, at page 1057, is amended to read as follows:
13	(3) Base SEEK Allotments: Notwithstanding KRS 157.420(2), included in the above
14	General Fund appropriation is \$2,101,558,200 in fiscal year 2016-2017 and
15	\$2,089,985,500 in fiscal year 2017-2018 for the base SEEK Program as defined by
16	KRS 157.360. Funds appropriated to the SEEK Program shall be allotted to school
17	districts in accordance with KRS 157.310 to 157.440, except that the total of the
18	funds allotted shall not exceed the appropriations for this purpose except as
19	provided in this Act. Notwithstanding KRS 157.360(2)(c), included in the
20	appropriation for the base SEEK Program is \$214,752,800 in each fiscal year for
21	pupil transportation. Notwithstanding KRS 157.310 to 157.440, included in the
22	above amount is \$7,000,000 in fiscal year 2017-2018 for the Emergency
23	Revolving School Loan Fund account established in KRS 160.599.
24	→ Section 3. Whereas local school districts need access to funds provided through
25	the emergency revolving school loan fund account for the current school year, an
26	emergency is declared to exist, and this Act takes effect upon its passage and approval by

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the Governor or upon its otherwise becoming a law.

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
