16		identity of the patient requesting treatment via the assessment mechanism;
17		(c) The assessment mechanism is designed and operated in a manner that

8		(g) The owner or lessee of the assessment mechanism maintains liability
9		insurance in an amount adequate to cover claims made by individuals
10		diagnosed or treated based on information and data, including photographs
11		and scans, generated by the assessment mechanism;
12		(h) The assessment mechanism creates and maintains a medical record for
13		each patient, which is for use during the ongoing treatment of a patient,
14		and complies with all state and federal laws regarding maintenance and
15		accessibility;
16		(i) There is simultaneous interaction between the patient and the Kentucky-
17		licensed optometrist, osteopath, or physician; and
18		(j) The Kentucky-licensed optometrist, osteopath, or physician utilizing an
19		assessment mechanism provides a handwritten or electronic signature
20		certifying their evaluation, treatment, prescription, or consultation
21		recommendations of the patient.
22	(2)	A person shall not operate an assessment mechanism to conduct an eye
23		assessment or to generate a prescription to a patient under the age of eighteen
24		(18) years old at a Kentucky residence.
25	<u>(3)</u>	A person shall not operate an assessment mechanism to conduct an eye
26		assessment or to generate a prescription for visual aid glasses or contact lenses to
27		a patient at a Kentucky residence unless:

1		<u>(a) The patient has received an in-person comprehensive eye health</u>
2		examination by an optometrist, osteopath, or physician within the previous
3		twenty-four (24) months; and
4		(b) The patient's medical history, previous prescription for corrective evewear,
5		and length of time since the patient's most recent in-person comprehensive
6		eye health examination is collected.
7	<u>(4)</u>	Prior to receiving an assessment, each Kentucky patient shall be provided with
8		and shall accept as a term of use a disclosure that includes the following
9		information:
10		(a) This assessment shall not be a replacement for an in-person comprehensive
11		eye health examination;
12		(b) This assessment shall only be used if the patient has had an in-person
13		comprehensive eye health examination within the previous twenty-four (24)
14		<u>months;</u>
15		(c) The United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)
16		advises contact lens wearers to visit an eye doctor one (1) time a year or
17		more often if needed; and
18		(d) Prior to receiving an assessment, the patient shall provide the month and
19		year that he or she received the most recent in-person comprehensive eye
20		health examination.
21	<u>(5)</u>	Evaluation, treatment, and consultation recommendations by a Kentucky-

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1 KRS 367.680 to 367.690 may be cited as the Consumer Protection in Eye Care Act.
