26	(2) A Kentucky-licensed optometrist, osteopath, or physician shall:
27	(a) Read and interpret the diagnostic information and data, including any

1	photographs and scans, gathered by the assessment mechanism;
2	(b) Verify the identity of the patient requesting treatment via the assessment

4	(c) Create and maintain a medical record for each patient, which is for use
5	during the ongoing treatment of a patient, and complies with all state and
6	federal laws regarding maintenance and accessibility;

8	state license number, certifying their diagnosis, evaluation, treatment,
9	prescription, or consultation recommendations of the patient;

12	1. The patient is at least eighteen (18) years of age; and
13	2. The patient has received an in-person comprehensive eye health
14	examination by an optometrist, osteopath, or physician within the
15	previous twenty-four (24) months; and
16	(f) Utilize an assessment mechanism to generate a prescription for contact
17	lenses only if:
18	1. The patient is at least eighteen (18) years of age; and
19	2. The patient has received an in-person comprehensive eye health
20	examination by an optometrist, osteopath, or physician:
21	a. For the initial prescription and one (1) follow-up or first renewal
22	of the initial prescription; or
23	b. Within twenty-four (24) months after the follow-up or first
24	renewal of the initial prescription, and every twenty-four (24)
25	months thereafter.
26	(3) Prior to using an assessment mechanism, each Kentucky patient shall be
27	provided with and shall accept as a term of use a disclosure that includes the

1	following information:
2	(a) This assessment is not a replacement for an in-person comprehensive eye
3	health examination;
4	(b) This assessment cannot be used to generate an initial prescription for
5	contact lenses or a follow-up or first renewal of the initial prescription;
6	(c) This assessment may only be used if the patient has had an in-person
7	<u>comprehensive eye health examination within the previous twenty-four (24)</u>
8	months if the patient is conducting an eye assessment or receiving a
9	prescription for visual aid glasses; and
10	(d) The United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)
11	advises contact lens wearers to visit an eye doctor one (1) time a year or
12	<u>more often if needed.</u>
13	(4) Evaluation, treatment, and consultation recommendations by a Kentucky-
14	licensed optometrist, osteopath, or physician utilizing an assessment mechanism
15	as required in this section, including issuing a prescription via electronic means,
16	shall be held to the same standards of appropriate practice as those in traditional
17	in-person clinical settings.
18	(5) This section shall not:
19	(a) Limit the discretion of a Kentucky-licensed optometrist, osteopath, or
20	physician to direct a patient to utilize any telehealth service deemed
21	appropriate for any treatment and care of the patient;
22	(b) Limit the sharing of patient information, in whatever form, between an
23	optometrist, osteopath, or physician; or
24	(c) Apply beyond ocular health and eye care.

27	dispensers of contact lenses and visual aid glasses.

3		or visual aid glasses in violation of KRS 367.680 to 367.690 or the administrative

5		contact lenses or visual aid glasses shall, in addition to any other penalty provided
6		by law, pay a civil penalty to the office of the Attorney General in an amount not to
7		exceed eleven thousand dollars (\$11,000)[five thousand dollars (\$5,000)] for each
8		violation.
9	(2)	Any person charged in a complaint filed by the Attorney General with violating any
10		of the provisions of KRS 367.680 to 367.690 shall be entitled to an administrative
