doctoral programs. The maximum of eighteen (18) advanced practice doctoral programs shall include programs approved under subsection (2)(b) of this section and Ed.D. programs approved under subsection (1)(b) of this section. Upon approval of the eighteenth advanced practice doctoral program, or the expiration of five (5) years from July 12, 2012, whichever occurs first, the Council on Postsecondary Education, in consultation with the Advisory Conference of Presidents, shall assess the review and approval process required by subsection (4) of this section. As part of this assessment, the council shall determine whether the process is meeting the requirements set forth in administrative regulations required by subsection (5) of this section. Upon completion of the assessment, the council may, with the unanimous consent of the Advisory Conference of Presidents, retain the current maximum or recommend a new maximum for consideration of the General Assembly during a regular session of the legislature].

(3)[(4)] The Council on Postsecondary Education, in consultation with the Advisory Conference of Presidents pursuant to KRS 164.021, shall develop criteria and conditions upon which an advanced practice doctoral degree program may be approved. The criteria shall include but not be limited to a determination of the academic and workforce needs for a program, consideration of whether the program can be effectively delivered through a collaborative effort with an existing program at another public university within the Commonwealth, and the capacity of a university to effectively offer the program. A university requesting approval of an advanced practice doctoral program shall be required to provide assurance that funding for the program will not impair funding of any existing program at any other public university. The university shall make an annual report to the council identifying the full cost of and all funding sources for each approved doctoral program and the performance of each approved program. Nothing in this subsection shall prohibit the council from approving a doctoral program under consideration at
