Section 1. KRS 164.2844 is amended to read as follows: \blacksquare

- 4 [Notwithstanding KRS 164.020(8):]
- 5 (1) <u>Notwithstanding KRS 164.020(8)</u>, the governing board of a Kentucky public 6 university may adopt a tuition policy whereby any veteran of the Armed Forces of 7 the United States or National Guard who is eligible for Post-9/11 GI Bill benefits or 8 any member of a Reserve component who enrolls as a student in the university as a 9 non-Kentucky resident is charged no more than the maximum tuition 10 reimbursement provided under the Post-9/11 GI Bill to public universities for 11 eligible Kentucky residents.[; and]
- 12 (2) <u>Notwithstanding KRS 164.020(8)</u>, beginning with the 2017-2018 academic year, an
 13 active member of the Kentucky National Guard who enrolls as a student in a
 14 Kentucky public university as a non-Kentucky resident shall be considered a
 15 Kentucky resident for tuition purposes.
- 16 (3) A member of the United States Armed Forces, or a spouse or dependent of a
- 17 *member, who is determined to be a Kentucky resident at the time of acceptance*
- 18 <u>for admission by a public postsecondary institution under the guidelines</u>
- 19 <u>established by the council shall not lose Kentucky residency status if the member</u>
- 20 is transferred on military orders prior to the member, spouse, or dependent
- 21 enrolling in the institution for the academic term for which the member, spouse,
- 22 or dependent was accepted or while the student is enrolled. The member, spouse,
- 23 or dependent shall not lose Kentucky residency if he or she remains continuously
- 24 <u>enrolled in the institution at the same degree level.</u>
