7		<u>(a)</u>	The members of the General Assembly, other than the Speaker of the House
8			of Representatives, the President of the Senate, the Speaker Pro Tempore of
9			the House of Representatives, President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and the
10			majority and minority leadership of each house of the General Assembly, shall
11			each receive as compensation one hundred dollars (\$100) per day;[,]
12		<u>(b)</u>	The President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives
13			shall each receive as compensation one hundred twenty-five dollars (\$125) per
14			day <u>;[,]</u>
15		<u>(c)</u>	The majority and minority floor leaders of each house of the General
16			Assembly shall each receive as compensation one hundred twenty dollars
17			(\$120) per day <u>; [,]</u> and
18		<u>(d)</u>	The President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker Pro Tempore, and the
19			majority and minority caucus chairmen and whips of each house of the
20			General Assembly shall each receive as compensation one hundred fifteen

22	<u>(2)</u>	In ac	ddition to his or her compensation as a member of the General Assembly, each
23		<u>chai</u>	<u><math>r[chairman]</math> of a standing committee of the House of Representatives or the</u>
24		Sena	te shall receive compensation of ten dollars (\$10) for each regularly scheduled
25		meet	ting of the standing committee which <u>the member[he]</u> chairs during sessions of
26		the C	General Assembly.

(3) Except as provided in subsection (4) of this section and beginning as of July 1,

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1 1980, each member of the General Assembly shall receive mileage and 2 reimbursement of road tolls for one (1) round trip for each week of the session actually traveled between the member's [his] home and the State Capitol during 3 4 regular sessions and extraordinary sessions of the General Assembly and the 5 necessary travel in going to and returning from the sessions of their respective 6 houses. The mileage allowance under this section shall be equal to the maximum 7 mileage allowance permitted by the federal government, to be increased as federal 8 mileage allowance is increased. 9 (4) In the event of an extraordinary session called under Section 80 of the 10 Constitution of Kentucky, no compensation or expense reimbursement authorized 11 under this section shall be paid to any member during those days declared as veto 12 days by the General Assembly, except as provided under KRS 7.090(11). As used in subsection (4) of this section, "veto day" means any day in which 13 (5) 14 neither chamber meets while awaiting gubernatorial action on legislation enacted 15 during that extraordinary session. 16 → Section 2. KRS 6.211 is amended to read as follows: 17 (1) *Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section*, effective January 1, 1994, in 18 addition to any and all sums, compensation, or expenses now paid the members of 19 the General Assembly, each shall receive an expense allowance of one hundred ten 20 percent (110%) of the expense allowance paid federal employees traveling in the

- Frankfort, Kentucky area for each calendar day. This sum shall be paid whether the General Assembly is in regular or extraordinary session and shall be in full recompense of any additional expenses incurred in excess of that now received by them.
- 25 (2) In the event of an extraordinary session called under Section 80 of the
  26 Constitution of Kentucky, no additional expense allowance authorized under this
  27 section shall be paid to any member during those days declared as veto days by

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1		the General Assembly. For any veto day, the member shall be allowed expenses
2		under KRS 6.213 and KRS 7.090(11).
3	<u>(3)</u>	As used in this section, "veto day" means any day in which neither chamber
4		meets while awaiting gubernatorial action on legislation enacted during that
5		extraordinary session.
6		$\rightarrow$ Section 3. Whereas it is essential that the financial resources of the
7	Con	monwealth be protected, an emergency is declared to exist, and this Act takes effect
8	upor	its passage and approval by the Governor or upon its otherwise becoming law.
