1	AN ACT relating to foreign law.
2	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
3	→ SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 454 IS CREATED TO
4	READ AS FOLLOWS:
5	(1) It shall be the policy of this state to protect its citizens from the application of
6	foreign laws when the application of a foreign law will result in the violation of a
7	right guaranteed by the Constitution of this state or of the United States.
8	(2) As used in this section:
9	(a) ''Foreign law'' means any law, rule, or legal code or system established and
10	used or applied in a jurisdiction outside of the states or territories of the
11	United States;
12	(b) ''Juridical person'' means a corporation or other organizational entity; and
13	(c) ''Natural person'' means a human being.
14	(3) A court, arbitrator, administrative agency, or other adjudicative body or authority
15	shall not enforce a foreign law if doing so would violate a right guaranteed by the
16	Constitution of this state or of the United States.
17	(4) If any contractual provision or agreement provides for the choice of a foreign law
18	to govern its interpretation or the resolution of any claim or dispute between the
19	parties, and if the enforcement or interpretation of the contractual provision or
20	agreement would result in a violation of a right guaranteed by the Constitution of
21	this state or of the United States, the contractual provision or agreement shall be
22	interpreted or construed to the extent necessary to preserve the constitutional
23	rights of the person against whom enforcement is sought.
24	(5) (a) If any contractual provision or agreement provides for the choice of venue
25	or forum outside of the states or territories of the United States, and if the
26	enforcement or interpretation of the contract or agreement applying that
27	choice of venue or forum provision would result in a violation of any right

1		guaranteed by the Constitution of this state or of the United States, the
2		contractual provision or agreement shall be interpreted or construed to
3		preserve the constitutional rights of a person against whom enforcement is
4		<u>sought.</u>
5	(b) If a natural person subject to personal jurisdiction in this state seeks to
6		maintain litigation, arbitration, agency, or similarly binding proceedings in
7		this state, and if a court of this state finds that granting a claim of forum
8		non conveniens or a related claim violates or would likely lead to the
9		violation of the constitutional rights of the nonclaimant in the foreign
10		forum with respect to the matter in dispute, such claim shall be denied.
11	<u>(6)</u> 7	This section shall not be interpreted to limit a natural person's right to
12	<u>v</u>	coluntarily restrict or limit a person's constitutional rights by contract or specific
13	<u>N</u>	vaiver consistent with constitutional principles, but the language of any such
14	<u>c</u>	contract or other waiver shall be strictly construed in favor of preserving the
15	<u>C</u>	constitutional rights of the person.
16	<u>(7)</u> A	Any contractual provision or agreement incapable of being interpreted or
17	<u>C</u>	construed in order to preserve the constitutional rights of the parties pursuant to
18	<u>t</u>	his section shall be null and void.
19	<u>(8)</u> V	Without prejudice to any other legal right, this section shall not apply when a
20	j	uridical person is a party to the contract or agreement.
