1	AN ACT proposing an amendment to Section 170 of the Constitution of Kentucky	
2	relating to	property exempt from taxation.
3	Be it enac	ted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
4	⇒S	ection 1. It is proposed that Section 170 of the Constitution of Kentucky be
5	amended to read as follows:	
6	<u>(1)</u>	There shall be exempt from taxation:
7	<u>(a)</u>	Public property used for public purposes;
8	<u>(b)</u>	Places of burial not held for private or corporate profit;
9	<u>(c)</u>	Real property owned and occupied by, and personal property both tangible
10	and intangible owned by, institutions of religion;	
11	<u>(d)</u>	Institutions of purely public charity; [, and]
12	<u>(e)</u>	Institutions of education not used or employed for gain by any person or
13	corporation, and the income of which is devoted solely to the cause of education: $\frac{1}{2}$	
14	<u>(f)</u>	Public libraries, their endowments, and the income of such property as is used
15	exclusively for their maintenance;	
16	<u>(g)</u>	Household goods of a person used in his <i>or her</i> home; <i>and</i>
17	<u>(h)</u>	Crops grown in the year in which the assessment is made [,] and in the hands
18	of the producer.	
19	(2)	(a) There shall be a partial exemption from taxation for a homestead,
20	which is[; and] real property maintained as the permanent residence of the owner, if the	
21	<u>owner:</u>	
22	<u>1.</u>	[who ]Is sixty-five years of age or older;
23	<u>2.</u>	Is a disabled veteran with a combined disability rating of at least fifty
24	percent by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs; or	
25	<u>3.</u>	[, or ]Is classified as totally disabled under a program authorized or
26	administered by an agency of the United States government or by any retirement system	
27	either within or without the Commonwealth of Kentucky.	

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## 1 (b) In order to qualify for the partial exemption on the basis of a disability, the 2 owner shall have: 3 [, provided the property owner ]Received disability payments pursuant to <u>1.</u> 4 *the*[such] disability classification;[.] 5 <u>2.</u> [ has ]Maintained <u>the[such]</u> disability classification for the <u>entire[entirety of</u> 6 the particular] taxation period;[,] and 7 **has** Filed with the appropriate local assessor by December 31 of the taxation <u>3.</u> 8 period, on forms provided therefor, a signed statement, made under penalty of perjury, 9 indicating continuing disability as provided herein. (c) The amount of the partial exemption shall be [made under penalty of 10 11 perjury, ]up to the assessed valuation of sixty-five hundred dollars, which shall be 12 *indexed every two years*, on *the*[said] residence and contiguous real property, except: 13 1. For assessment for special benefits; and 14 2. For a disabled veteran, which shall be sixty-five hundred dollars, indexed 15 every two years, multiplied by the combined disability rating of the owner. 16 (d)The real property may be held by legal or equitable title, by the entireties, 17 jointly, in common, as a condominium, or indirectly by the stock ownership or 18 membership representing the owner's or member's proprietary interest in a corporation 19 owning a fee or a leasehold initially in excess of ninety-eight years. 20 The exemptions shall apply only to the value of the real property assessable to (e) 21 the owner or, in case of ownership through stock or membership in a corporation, the 22 value of the proportion which his interest in the corporation bears to the assessed value of 23 the property. 24 The General Assembly may authorize any incorporated city or town to exempt (**f**) 25 manufacturing establishments from municipal taxation, for a period not exceeding five 26 years, as an inducement to their location. Notwithstanding the provisions of Sections 3, 172, and 174 of this 27 $(\boldsymbol{g})$

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Constitution to the contrary, the General Assembly may provide by law an exemption for
all or any portion of the property tax for any class of personal property.

Section 2. This amendment shall be submitted to the voters of the Commonwealth for their ratification or rejection at the time and in the manner provided for under Sections 256 and 257 of the Constitution and under KRS 118.415. The question to be submitted to the voters shall read as follows: "Are you in favor of amending the Kentucky Constitution to allow partially disabled veterans a portion of the homestead exemption from property tax based on the veteran's combined disability rating?".
