1	AN ACT relating to the Kentucky 911 Services Board.
2	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
3	→ Section 1. KRS 65.7623 is amended to read as follows:
4	(1) There is hereby created the Kentucky 911 Services Board, the "board," consisting of
5	nine (9) members as follows:
6	(a) The executive director of the Office of Homeland Security;
7	(b) The secretary of the Public Protection Cabinet;
8	(c) The commissioner of the Department for Local Government;
9	(d) The director of the Division of Emergency Management;
10	(e) Two (2) elected city officials of a city government appointed by the Kentucky
11	League of Cities;
12	(f) Two (2) elected county officials of a county government appointed by the
13	Kentucky Association of Counties; and
14	(g) A director of a certified PSAP operated by a local government entity of a
15	consolidated group of local governmental entities appointed by the executive
16	director of the Office of Homeland Security from a list of three (3)
17	nominees jointly submitted by the Kentucky Emergency Number
18	Association and the Association of Public Communications Officials fifteen
19	(15) members, eleven (11) of whom shall be voting members appointed by the
20	Governor, two (2) of whom shall be voting members who shall serve by virtue
21	of their offices, and two (2) shall be nonvoting legislative members, as
22	follows: two (2) members shall be employed by or representative of the
23	interest of CMRS providers, of which, one (1) shall be a representative of a
24	Tier III CMRS provider; two (2) members serving as city officials, one (1) of
25	which shall be an elected city official, from a list of four (4) nominees
26	submitted by the Kentucky League of Cities; two (2) members serving as
27	county officials, both of which shall be elected county officials, from a list of

four (4) nominees submitted by the Kentucky Association of Counties; one (1)
member shall be appointed from a list of local exchange landline telephone
companies' representatives submitted by the Kentucky Telephone Association
one (1) member shall be a director of a certified public safety answering point
operated by a local governmental entity or a consolidated group of local
governmental entities appointed from lists of candidates submitted to the
Governor by the Kentucky Firefighters Association, the State Association of
Chiefs of Police, the Kentucky Sheriff's Association, and the Kentucky
Ambulance Providers Association; two (2) members shall be appointed from
lists of candidates submitted to the Governor by the Kentucky Emergency
Number Association and the Association of Public Communications Officials
one (1) member shall be a director of a certified public safety answering poin
operated by a local government entity or a consolidated group of local
governmental entities; and two (2) nonvoting legislative members to serve
solely in advisory capacities for terms of two (2) years, one (1) of whom shall
be a member of the House of Representatives to be appointed by the Speaker
of the House of Representatives and one (1) of whom shall be a member of
the Senate to be appointed by the President of the Senate. The commissioner
of the Department of Kentucky State Police, or the commissioner's designee
and the executive director of the Office of Homeland Security, or the
executive director's designee, also shall be voting members of the board. Any
vacancy on the board shall be filled in the same manner as the original
appointment].

(2) The <u>Commissioner of the Department of Kentucky State Police and the</u> executive director of the Office of Homeland Security, <u>secretary of the Public Protection</u>

<u>Cabinet, commissioner of the Department for Local Government, and director of the Division of Emergency Management</u> shall serve by virtue of their offices. The

other members appointed under paragraphs (e) to (g) of subsection (1) of this			
section shall be appointed [nonlegislative members shall be appointed by the			
Governor] for a term of four (4) years and until their successors are appointed and			
qualified, and may only serve as long as the appointee holds the office or position			
they held at the time of their appointment. Any vacancy on the board shall be			
filled in the same manner as the original appointment and shall be for the			
remainder of the unexpired term[except that of the first appointments, one (1) shall			
be for a term of one (1) year, one (1) shall be for a term of two (2) years, one (1) for			
a term of three (3) years, and two (2) shall be for a term of four (4) years. Any			
member missing three (3) consecutive meetings may be removed by a majority vote			
of the remaining voting members].			
No member of the board shall be held to be a public officer by reason of			
membership on the board. The elected city and county officials appointed under			
subsection (1) of this section shall each serve on the board in an ex officio voting			
capacity by virtue of their respective elected offices as long as they continue to			
occupy their local elected positions during the four (4) year term as a board			
member. Their duties as members of the board shall be an extension of their			
duties as local elected officials and their service on the board shall not constitute			
the holding of a separate and distinct public office apart from their respective			
local elected positions.			
The executive director of the Office of Homeland Security shall serve as chair			
and[board shall elect a chair from among its voting members to] preside over			
meetings of the board, which shall be conducted at least four (4) times each year. <u>In</u>			
the absence of the executive director of the Office of Homeland Security, the			
board may be chaired by any other member of the board selected by the			
<u>remaining members.</u> The board shall be subject to the provisions of the Kentucky			
Open Meetings Act, KRS 61.805 to 61.850. The board shall establish a regular			

1	meeting schedule for each calendar year. The board shall hold at least two (2)			
2	meetings per calendar year in congressional districts other than the one in which			
3	Frankfort is located, and shall rotate its traveling meeting locations among the			
4	congressional districts before holding another traveling meeting in the same			
5	congressional district. A majority of the [voting] members appointed to the board			
6	shall constitute a quorum.			
7	(5) $\{(4)\}$ In addition to the administrator appointed by the <u>executive director of the</u>			
8	Office of Homeland Security[board] under KRS 65.7625, the [Kentucky] Office of			
9	Homeland Security shall provide staff services, office space and other resources			
10	necessary to conduct its affairs [and carry out administrative duties and functions			
11	as directed by the board]. The board shall be attached to the [Kentucky] Office of			
12	Homeland Security for administrative purposes <u>but</u> [only and] shall operate as an			
13	independent entity within state government.			
14	(6) [(5)] The board members shall serve without compensation but shall be reimbursed			
15	in accordance with KRS 45.101 for expenses incurred in connection with their			
16	official duties as members of the board.			
17	(7) [(6)] All administrative costs and expenses incurred in the operation of the board,			
18	including payments under subsections (5) and (6) [subsection (5)] of this section			
19	and Section 2 of this Act, shall be paid as reimbursement to the Office of			
20	Homeland Security from that portion of the CMRS fund that is authorized under			
21	KRS 65.7631(2) to be used by the board for administrative purposes.			
22	(8) Prior to June 1 of each year, the Office of Homeland Security shall submit a			
23	budget detailing all projected administrative and operational expenses for the			
24	subsequent fiscal year to be used by the board in establishing the board's budget			
25	for the upcoming fiscal year.			
26	(9) The board may be advised by any permanent or temporary advisory council or			
27	councils it may elect to create by official action.			

1	<u>(10)</u>	The board established by this section and its powers and duties as set forth in this		
2		section and in KRS 65.7643 shall not be subject to the provisions of KRS 12.028.		
3		→ Section 2. KRS 65.7625 is amended to read as follows:		
4	(1)	The <u>executive director of the Office of Homeland Security</u> [Kentucky 911 Services		
5		Board] shall appoint a state administrator of commercial mobile radio service		
6		emergency telecommunications. The <u>executive director of the Office of Homeland</u>		
7		<u>Security</u> [board] shall set the administrator's compensation, <u>the cost of which may</u>		
8		be shared by the Office of Homeland Security and the Kentucky 911 Services		
9		Board. The board shall be responsible for any portion of the administrator's		
10		salary that is not to be paid by the Office of Homeland Security, with the board's		
11		portion of the salary to [which shall] be paid from that portion of the CMRS fund		
12		that is authorized under KRS 65.7631(2) to be used by the board for administrative		
13		purposes.		
14	(2)	The administrator of CMRS emergency telecommunications shall serve as the		
15		coordinator and administrator on behalf of the board, and shall conduct the day-to-		
16		day operations of the board.		
17	(3)	The administrator shall, with the advice of the board, coordinate and direct a		
18		statewide effort to expand and improve enhanced emergency telecommunications		
19		capabilities and responses throughout the state, including but not limited to the		
20		implementation of wireless E911 service requirements of the FCC order and rules		
21		and regulations adopted in carrying out that order. In this regard, the administrator		
22		shall:		
23		(a) Obtain, maintain, and disseminate information relating to emergency		
24		telecommunications technology, advances, capabilities, and techniques;		
25		(b) Coordinate and assist in the implementation of advancements and new		
26		technology in the operation of emergency telecommunications in the state,		
27		including the development and implementation of next generation 911

2	(c)	Implement compliance throughout the state with the wireless E911 service
3		requirements established by the FCC order and any rules or regulations which
4		are or may be adopted by the Federal Communications Commission in
5		carrying out the FCC order; and

(d) Perform all functions and duties assigned by the board in carrying out the purposes of KRS 65.7621 to 65.7643, including but not limited to making a full report to the board at each meeting of the activities in which the administrator has engaged in the discharge of his or her duties since the previous meeting.
