3		→ Section 1. KRS 158.4414 is amended to read as follows:
4	(1)	Local boards of education, school district superintendents, administrators of state-
5		controlled facilities, and local and state law enforcement agencies shall cooperate to
6		assign one (1) or more certified school resource officers to serve each school in the
7		district[campus where one (1) or more school buildings are used to deliver
8		instruction to students on a continuous basis as funds and qualified personnel
9		become available].
10	(2)	(a) By July 1, 2025, local boards of education shall ensure, for each school in
11		the district, that at least one (1) certified school resource officer is assigned
12		to and working on-site full-time in each school building.
13		(b) Until July 1, 2025:
14		1. If qualified personnel are not available for this purpose for every
15		school, the local board of education shall fulfill the requirements of
16		this subsection on a per school basis, as approved in writing by the
17		state school security marshal, until a certified school resource officer
18		is assigned to and working on-site full-time in each school in the
19		district; and
20		2. The state school security marshal shall use the incidents listed in KRS
21		158.444(2)(b)1. to determine the necessity for placement of certified
22		school resource officers within the schools of a district as described in
23		subparagraph 1. of this paragraph.
24	<u>(3)</u>	The General Assembly shall appropriate funds to the Center for School Safety to
25		cover the costs of providing a full-time certified school resource officer in each
26		school. The Center for School Safety shall disseminate the appropriated funds to
2.7		districts through the center's school safety grant program.

Local boards of education utilizing a school resource officer employed by a law
enforcement agency or the Department of Kentucky State Police shall enter into a
memorandum of understanding with the law enforcement agency or the Department
of Kentucky State Police that specifically states the purpose of the school resource
officer program and clearly defines the roles and expectations of each party
involved in the program. The memorandum shall provide that the school resource
officer shall not be responsible for school discipline matters that are the
responsibility of school administrators or school employees.

(5)[(3)] Local boards of education utilizing a school resource officer employed directly by the local board of education shall adopt policies and procedures that specifically state the purpose of the school resource officer program and clearly define the roles and expectations of school resource officers and other school employees.

(6)[(4)] In accordance with KRS 61.926, 527.020, and 527.070, as applicable, each school resource officer shall be armed with a firearm <u>or taser</u>, notwithstanding any provision of local board policy, local school council policy, or memorandum of agreement.

(7)[(5)] [On or before January 1, 2020,]The Kentucky Law Enforcement Council, in collaboration with the Center for School Safety, shall promulgate administrative regulations in accordance with KRS Chapter 13A to establish three (3) levels of training for certification of school resource officers first employed as a school resource officer on or after March 11, 2019: School Resource Officer Training I (SRO I), School Resource Officer Training II (SRO II), and School Resource Officer Training III (SRO III). Each level shall consist of forty (40) hours of training, with SRO I to be completed within one (1) year of the date of the officer's employment and SRO II and SRO III within the subsequent two (2) years.

21	<u>(11)</u> [(9)]	Any school resource officer who fails to successfully complete training
22	requ	irements within the specified time periods, including any approved time
23	exte	nsions, shall lose his or her school resource officer certification and shall no
24	long	er serve in the capacity of a school resource officer in a school.
25	<u>(12)</u> [(10)]	When a school resource officer is deficient in required training, the
26	com	missioner of the Department of Criminal Justice Training or his or her designee

shall notify the council, which shall notify the officer and the officer's employing

2	(13)[(11)] A school resource officer who has lost school resource officer certification
3	due solely to the officer's failure to meet the training requirements of this section
4	may regain certification status as a school resource officer and may resume service
5	in the capacity of a school resource officer in a school setting upon successful
6	completion of the training deficiency.
7	(14)[(12)] No later than November 1 of each year, the local school district superintendent
8	shall report to the Center for School Safety the number and placement of school
9	resource officers in the district. The report shall include the source of funding and
10	method of employment for each position.
