5	(1)	(a)	Effective July 1, 2022, the cabinet shall institute a one-time increase in the
6			Medicaid reimbursement rates for all services provided by a Medicaid-
7			participating provider to a Medicaid beneficiary; and
8		(b)	The reimbursement rate increase required by this subsection shall be in an
9			amount equal to the reimbursement rate in effect on January 1, 2020,
10			multiplied by 10%;
11	(2)	An	authorized Medicaid-participating provider who receives the increased
12		rein	bursement rate described in subsection (1) of this section:
13		(a)	Shall use at least 75% of the amount by which the reimbursement rate was
14			increased to increase wages paid to non-executive, hourly wage staff who are
15			employed or contracted by the authorized Medicaid-participating provider to
16			provide services in Kentucky;
17		(b)	Shall document use of the reimbursement rate increase to increase wages paid
18			to non-executive, hourly wage staff using a software program or tool
19			developed by the Department for Medicaid Services. The Department for
20			Medicaid Services is strongly encouraged to consider tools previously
21			developed by other states when developing this reporting tool; and
22		(c)	May use the remaining 25% of the amount by which the reimbursement rate
23			was increased for other employer-related costs, including but not limited to:
24			1. Administrative expenses;
25			2. Payroll taxes;
26			3. Employee benefits; and
27			4. Paid time off for hourly wage staff;

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- If a Medicaid-participating provider who receives the increased reimbursement rate
   described in subsection (1) of this section does not use the increase as permitted by
   subsection (2) of this section, the Department for Medicaid Services shall recoup
   funds from the provider as follows:
- (a) If the provider used no portion of the increase to increase non-executive,
  hourly staff wages, the Department for Medicaid Services shall recoup an
  amount equal to 100% of the reimbursement rate increase;
- 8 (b) If the provider used some portion of the increase but less than 75% of the 9 increase to increase non-executive, hourly staff wages, the Department for 10 Medicaid Services shall recoup an amount equal to 75% of the reimbursement 11 rate increase minus the amount that was used to increase direct support 12 professional or direct care staff wages;
- (4) By October 1, 2024, the Cabinet for Health and Family Services shall provide the
   Legislative Research Commission with an analysis of the effect of the
   reimbursement rate increase on the wages non-executive, hourly wage staff;

   regulations necessary to carry out this section; and

If the Cabinet for Health and Family Services or the Department for Medicaid Services determines that a waiver or any other authorization from a federal agency is necessary prior to the implementation of any provision of Section 1 of this Act, the cabinet or department shall, within 90 days after the effective date of this Act, request the waiver or authorization and shall only delay full implementation of those provisions for which a waiver or authorization was deemed necessary until the waiver or
