AN ACT relating to computation of time in state administrative bodies.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:

→SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 12 IS CREATED TO READ AS FOLLOWS:

Every organizational unit, department, division, branch, section, unit, office, and administrative body in state government shall compute time as follows:

- (1) In computing any period of time prescribed or allowed by order of court, or by any applicable statute or administrative regulation, the day of the act, event, or default after which the designated period of time begins to run is not to be included. The last day of the period so computed is to be included, unless it is a Saturday, a Sunday, a legal holiday, or a day on which the public office in which a document is required to be filed is actually and legally closed, in which event the period runs until the end of the next day which is not a Saturday, Sunday, legal holiday, or day on which the public office is closed. When the period of time prescribed or allowed is less than seven (7) days, intermediate Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays shall be excluded in the computation.
- (2) When a statute, administrative regulation, or order of court requires an act to be accomplished either a certain time before an event or a certain time before the day on which an event occurs, the day of the event shall be excluded in computing the time. If the day thereby computed on which or by which the act is required to be accomplished falls on a Saturday, a Sunday, a legal holiday, or a day on which the public office in which the act is required to be completed is actually and legally closed, the act may be accomplished on the next day which is not a Saturday, Sunday, legal holiday, or day on which the public office is closed.
