5		initi	al instruction permit] shall submit to a test of visual acuity and visual field
6		<u>perf</u>	formed by a vision specialist, an advanced practice registered nurse as defined
7		in K	KRS 314.011, a physician assistant as defined in KRS 311.840, or a licensed
8		<u>phys</u>	vician prior to [at] the time of application or renewal:

21			have their driving privileges restricted to mandate the use of the corrective

23		<u>(c)</u>	If a person fails to meet a 20/40 visual acuity standard or the visual field
24			standard established by the Transportation Cabinet, the advanced practice
25			registered nurse, physician assistant, or licensed physician who performed
26			the person's vision screening shall refer the person[Department of Kentucky
27			State Police shall refer the person] to a vision specialist for examination.

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1	(4)[(3)] A person referred to a vision specialist [by the Department of Kentucky State				
2	Police] under subsection $(3)[(2)]$ of this section whose visual acuity is 20/60 or				
3	better and meets or exceeds the visual field standard established by the				
4	Transportation Cabinet shall be eligible for operator's license renewal under the				
5	provisions of subsection (1)(c) of this section or eligible to test for an instruction				
6	permit or operator's license. If corrective lenses were prescribed by the vision				
7	specialist, the person's driving privileges shall be restricted to mandate the use of				
8	the corrective lenses.				
9	(5)[(4)] Persons who meet the requirements of KRS 186.578 and are issued operator's				
10	licenses under KRS 186.579 shall have their driving privileges restricted to the use				
11	of a bioptic telescopic device.				
12	(6) A person seeking application or renewal under the provisions of subsection (1) of				
13	this section shall be deemed to meet the testing provisions outlined in subsection				
14	(3) of this section if the person submits a driver vision testing form completed by:				
15	(a) A vision specialist who performed the person's examination who attests that				
16	the person meets or exceeds the visual acuity standards outlined in				
17	subsection (3) or (4) of this section; or				
18	(b) An advanced practice registered nurse, physician assistant, or licensed				
19	physician who performed the person's vision screening who attests that the				
20	person meets or exceeds the visual acuity standard and visual field standard

22	(7) Any person who is seeking application or renewal under the provisions of				
23	subsection (1) of this section and was referred to a vison specialist under the				
24	provisions of subsection (3) of this section shall be deemed to meet the testing				
25	provisions outlined in subsection (4) of this section if the person submits a driver				
26	vision testing form completed by a vision specialist attesting that the person meets				
27	or exceeds the visual acuity standard and visual field standard as outlined in

2	<u>(8)</u>	A driver vision testing form completed under this section shall only be valid if the
3		vision examination or vision screening of the person seeking application or
4		renewal was performed less than twelve (12) months prior to the date of
5		application or renewal.
6	<u>(9)</u>	All driver vision testing forms completed under the provisions of subsection (6) or
7		(7) of this section shall state whether or not the driving privileges of the person
8		seeking application or renewal shall be restricted to mandate the use of corrective
9		<u>lenses.</u>
10	<u>(10)</u>	The Transportation Cabinet shall update the Kentucky Driver's License Renewal
11		Application to include an attestation by the person seeking application or renewal
12		that he or she has submitted to and passed the visual acuity and visual field tests
13		outlined in this section.
14	<u>(11)</u>	Any person renewing an operator's license under the provisions of KRS 186.416

24	(1)	The Department of Kentucky State Police shall examine every applicant for an
25		operator's license as identified in KRS 186.635, except as otherwise provided in this
26		section. The examination shall be held in the county where the applicant resides
27		unless:

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- (a) The applicant is granted written permission by the circuit clerk of the county
 in which he or she resides to take the examination in another county, and the
 Department of Kentucky State Police agree to arrange for the examination in
 the other county; or
 - (b) The applicant is tested using a bioptic telescopic device.

6 (2) The examination shall include a test of the applicant's evesight to ensure 7 compliance with the visual acuity standards set forth in KRS 186.577. The 8 examination shall also include a test of the applicant's ability to] read and 9 understand highway signs regulating, warning, and directing traffic, the applicant's 10 knowledge of traffic laws, and an actual demonstration of the applicant's ability to 11 exercise ordinary and reasonable control in the operation of a motor vehicle. An 12 applicant for a motorcycle operator's license shall be required to show his or her 13 ability to operate a motorcycle, in addition to other requirements of this section. The 14 provisions of this subsection shall not apply to an applicant who:

- 15 (a) At the time of application, holds a valid operator's license from another state,
 provided that state affords a reciprocal exemption to a Kentucky resident; or

 license was suspended for failure to meet the conditions described in KRS 186.411
 when, within one (1) year of suspension, the driving privileges of such individuals
